

Special Meeting  
Wednesday, January 25-1956

A special meeting of the Council was held on Wednesday, January 25 and called to order at 8 o'clock P.M.

The Mayor announced that the meeting had been called for the purpose of discussing matters bro't out at the recent hearing of the P.U.C., relative to the speed of S.P. trains thro' Canby.

After a prolonged discussion, as to any future action, it was moved by Anderson, seconded by Beck and carried, that the petition now before the P.U.C., relative to the above matter, be withdrawn.

It was then moved by Hulbert, seconded by Kraft and carried, that the City Attorney be requested to negotiate with both the P.U.C and the Southern Pacific officials and report back to the Council, any proposition or suggestions they might have to offer, relative to the speed of the trains or safeguards in Canby.

No other business being presented, on motion, seconded and carried, the meeting then adjourned.
