

Regular Meeting
Monday, March 19-1956

A regular meeting of the Council was held on Monday, March 19-1956 and called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, City Atty. Bettis, City Engineer Tatone, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Hill, Hulbert, Kraft. Absent-Oathes.

The minutes of the previous meeting of March 5 were read and approved.

Mayor Eversole then announced that the City Engineer's report relative to the Sewer project for Canby had been received and filed in accordance with the legal requirements, and approved by the Council; and that this date, time and place had been set for objections to said report and proposed improvement, by any person or persons whomsoever.

The Mayor then called for objections, but none were presented.

It was then moved by Hulbert, seconded by Beck and carried, that the engineers be instructed to complete the plans for the following extensions to the original sewer set-up:

On Wait Avenue from trunk line to Ferry Road.
Alley between NW third and fourth-Grant to Elm
No. Ivy from alley between 5th. and 6th. to 135
feet No. of Virginia.
So. Ivy from SW 6th. avenue southerly to $\frac{11}{4}$ Sec. line.

Communications

From Mrs. Margaret Drew, Adm. of the Verna Martin estate objecting to the Sewer System installation.

From L.G. Rood, Principal of S/D #86, stating that it was the desire of the school board, that the City make provisions to connect up the sewer with the new school building to be constructed on NW 5th. Avenue.

From the American City Magazine asking for information concerning Canby's new treatment plant and sewer system. (Referred to Chamber of Commerce).

From Francis P. Schomus, 2510 Cherry Ave., Salem, objecting to his arrest for traffic violation on March 11 and criticising the conduct of the officer in handling the case.

It was then moved by Hulbert, seconded by Kraft and carried, that City Attorney Bettis be requested to prepare the necessary papers to place on the ballot at the May primary, for the approval of the voters-a 5 mill tax levy, for a six year period, to provide funds for needed equipment and maintenance of the Fire Department.

Chairman Anderson of the Light & Power committee then reported to the Council, that his committee was not favorable to the granting of service to applicants living outside the City limits.

The matter of improvements on So. Elm street, ^{FROM PACIFIC HI-WAY TO 44th AVE} being presented at this time, it was moved by Hulbert, seconded by Beck and carried, that the City Engineer be instructed to draw up plans for sidewalks and curbs, together with estimated costs; also that a copy of the same be mailed to property owners.

Whereupon, on motion, seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned.
