# Regular Meeting Monday, pril 2-1956

The City Council met in regular session on Monday, April 2 and was called to order at 8.10 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, City Atty. Bettis, City Engineer Tatone, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen, Anderson, Beck, Hill, Hulbert and Oathes. Absent-Kraft.

The minutes of the previous meeting of March 19th. were read and approved, after a correction as to Elm street proposed improvement.

City Treasurer Johnson then presented and read his quarterly report and on motion of Hill, seconded by Oathes and carried, approved subject to audit by the finance committee.

## Communications

From the Oregon Insurance Rating Bureau relative to the regrading of the fire protection facilities for Canby and stating that the necessary work would be done as soon as possible.

From Sheriff Reaksecker expressing appreciation, cooperation by Officer White during a recent investigation.

From the Blitz Weinhard Company announcing their 100th Anniversary.

### PETITIONS

Wm. Dreher presented a request for city water priveleges for a five acre tract recently platted in North Canby bordering Territorial Road and North Locust St. No action was taken.

Other sewer petitions were presented as follows:

On Knight's Bridge Road from Ferry Road to North Grant.

On S.W. Fifth Avenue, between So. Elm and So. Fir sts.

- On the street to be known as Maple Lane in the Asmunstad sub-division and running approximately 400 feet from Wait
  - Avenue to the Fair Grounds.

On motion, seconded and carried, the above were approved and plans to be drawn.

Another petition presented by C.E. Sorenson and others asking for a change of direction in the sewer line on No. Locust st. from Fourth Ave. to Wait avenue. On motion, seconded and carried, this was referred to the engineers in charge for their consideration and recommendation.

to Robt. Lewis then appeared before the Council and registered a complaint as the bad condition of the fence and posts on the east side of the Auto Wrecking fard on Second Avenue, stating that repairs or removal were necessary. Was told that the matter would receive attention.

The application of Marion Regier to operate a Auto Wrecking Yard was then presented and on motion by Oathes, seconded by Beck and carried, the same was declared approved subject to inspection and approval of the City Engineer.

#### Reports

Fire Chief Christiansen reported but one City call between the dates of March 4 and March 17 inc.; Six rural district calls, all resulting in minor damages. Also reported 17 ambulance calls between Febr. 25 and March 17.

Financial statement showed contributions of \$ 85.00 and expenses \$ 18.72, leaving bank balance of \$ 2794.89.

Cemetery Supt. Yoder reported receipts of \$ 160.00 for lots sold and \$ 180.00 for openings during March.

Police Dept. report submitted by officer White showed car mileage of 2470 miles and gas consumed 305 gals, also other activities such as arrests, warnings, investigations, assistance to State and County officers, etc.

The Recorder reported 23 cases in his Court during the month resulting in fines imposed of \$ 197.50-costs \$ 46.75, net \$ 150.75.

Fire Chief Christiansen then asked for the opinion of the Council members as to the holding of a "School of Instruction", which the Fire Department had under consideration. Whereupon on motion by Hill, seconded by Beck and carried, the Council voted its approval.

Chief Christiansen then stated that it seemed advisable to enter into a mutual aid agreement between the Canby Fire Dept. and Rural district and the Aurora Fire Dept.

Wherefore, on motion by Kraft, seconded by Oathes and carried, this matter was approved and ordered signd by the Mayor and Recorder.

Mayor Eversole then \_\_ated that, with the approval o.\_he Council, he would appoint Alfred Kraft and Virgil Giger as members of the Budget Committee, in place of Geo. Irwin and Clarence Eid, whose terms had expired.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Hulbert and carried, that these appointments be approved. desired

It then appearing that the Boy Scouts Organization, to use the gract of land recently deeded to the City and situated on the Molalla River in the So. westerly section of the City, it was moved by Beck, seconded by Oathes and carried, that the same be approved, subject to boundaries and liability matters to be investigated by the City attorney and Park Commissioner.

## RESOLUTION NO. 7

A resolution providing for a special election to be held in the City of Canby, Oregon, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters for their approval or rejection, the question of an annual levy of a direct ad valorem tax on all the taxable property within said City for the purpose of providing funds for the City's Fire Department.

The above Resolution was presented and read to the Council by City Attorney Bettis and on motion by Councilman Hill, seconded by Councilman Beck and carried, declared adopted.
