

Regular Meeting
Monday, May 7, 1956

The Council met in regular session on Monday, May 7 and was called to order at 8.15 P.M. Present-Mayor Eversole, Atty. Bettis, City Engineer Tatone, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Hill, Hulbert, Ktaft and Oathes.

The minutes of the previous meeting of April 16 were read and approved after change being made in the wording of the approval of the Cutsforth beer license.

Communications.

From the City Planning Commission recommending, "That Grant Street be kept open and an attempt be made at getting railroad warning lights installed at Elm and Ivy Streets.

From the Volunteer Fire Department strongly urging that the Grant Street crossing remain open to traffic.

Reports

Fire Chief reported no city calls and but one rural call, with no damage in April-plus one false alarm unexplained.

Ambulance service, seven times between March 23 and April 17, inc.

Contributions, \$ 137.00-Expenses, \$17.35-balance on hand \$ 2914.54.

Police Dept. reported -mileage 647 , gas consumed 119.5 gals ; one arrest, various investigations, warnings, assistance to State and County officers and other minor details.

The Recorder reported one Court case-fine \$ 5.00 (unpaid at this date).

Clayton Yoder, Cemetery caretaker reported \$ 180 received during the month for sale of lots and openings.

It was then moved by Hulbert, seconded by Hill and carried, that Rev. Lambert be notified of permission to use the City Library room on Tuesday May 22 for the purpose of completing the organization of the Community Club.

Mayor Eversole then stated that at this time, he would set Thursday, May 17 as annual " Clean-up Day ", on which day the city truck would be used for picking up garbage placed conveniently for that purpose.

Whereupon the matter of charges for installing meters and water service connections then appearing for discussion, it being evident that the present rates were resulting in considerable loss to the City, the Recorder was asked to write the League of Oregon Cities for information as to the practice in other cities of comparable size.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Oathes, that the Recorder contact the Southern Pacific Co. and ask for its estimate of costs to the City providing signal lights are installed at Ivy and Elm Streets, as mentioned in recent P.U.C. order. (carried)

It was then moved by Oathes, seconded by Hill and carried, that a warrant for \$ 10.00 be drawn to make up cash shortage as of April 2-1956.
