

Regular Monthly Meeting
Mo. y, June 6, 1955

The Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, June 6 and was called to order at 8.20 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Bettis, Eng. Tatone, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen-Anderson, Beck, Hill and Hulbert. Absent-Kraft and Oathes.

The minutes of the previous meetings of May 2-11th. and 25th. were read and Approved.

The Mayor then stated that the regular order of business would be suspended in order to discuss with Mr. Bartlett of the Southern Pacific Co. the idea of having a traffic signal installed at the R.R. crossing on Elm St.

After listening to Mr. Bartlett, it soon became apparent that the expense of such installation would be prohibitive at this time, as the City's half would be over \$4000.

Mr. Chas. Dunn from the Bonneville Power Administration office then addressed the Council with reference to the letter received recently, relative to rate schedules and also the communication from the engineers retained by the B.P.A. to make a comprehensive study of the same.

After explaining the matters involved and answering numerous questions, Mr. Dunn stated that he would be able to take care of what ever was required, with the help of our engineer.

It was then moved by Hill, seconded by Beck and carried, that the members of the Planning Commission be invited to attend, as guests of the City, the district meeting of the League of Oregon Cities to be held on June 16 in Milwaukie, preceded by a dinner at 6.30 o'clock P.M.

The matter of taking a census count of the population of Canby was then brought up, the idea having been favorably discussed at a previous meeting.

Whereupon, Atty Bettis outlined the laws and regulations under which this could be done under the supervision of the office of the Secretary of State.

He then read the Resolution, which it would be necessary to adopt in connection with the same, and on motion by Beck, seconded by Hill and carried, it was so adopted, ordered signed by the Mayor and Recorder and returned to the accounting division of the Secretary of State.

Communications.

From the League of Oregon Cities announcing the regional meeting to be held in Milwaukie on the evening of June 16 and urging a good attendance from Canby.

From Stan Skoko stating that, in his opinion, the charge of \$ 1.50 per hour for police matron service, where women prisoners are involved, would be out of order.

From the County Judge and Commissioner Darrell Jones, stating that the matter has been reconsidered and the County will provide the service at no additional charge to the cities.

From Will Gibson, Auditor of the City of Portland, enclosing copy of Resolution expressing appreciation to the League of Oregon Cities for assistance given at the 48th. Legislative Assembly of the Legislature of Oregon.

Reports

Police report by Fred Johnson showing activities for month of May-gas consumed 254 gals-mileage 2154. arrests, warnings, etc.

Recorder's report showing 45 cases in Court, resulting in fines of \$ 282.50, costs \$ 69.00. Building permits-one to Frank Blecha, new dwelling on Wait Avenue.

Fire Chief Christiansen reported no fire calls in City. Two calls in rural district, estimated damages \$ 650.00. Six ambulance calls between April 24 and May 13-financial report showing balance of \$ 2320.86.

Fire Chief also asked for permission to purchase a power motor-two hose nozzles and \$ 130 for expenses for Roseburg convention.

Whereupon, it was moved by Hulbert, seconded by Hill and carried, that the two nozzles (\$69.50) be allowed and the sum of \$ 130.00 to cover expenses of those attending the Roseburg meeting.

Chief Christensen also mentioned the need of a new fire truck in the not too distant future and it was thought that this could be discussed at the June 22 meeting.

Engineer Tatone reported having received permission from the State Highway Commission to remove various trees on 99E and suggested the need of new equipment to handle same; also thought new pickup truck would be in order.

It was then moved by Hulbert, seconded by Anderson that Commissioner Beck be authorized to employ labor for spraying at the Cemetery. Carried.

It was then moved by Hill, seconded by Anderson and carried, that the sewer easement under the conditions required by the Koehler estate be accepted.

Ordinance No. 389

The above Ordinance was read by Atty. Bettis and on motion by Beck, seconded by Hill passed on final reading and declared adopted. Roll call, Yeas 4, nays 0 .
