Reg¹ar Monthly Meeting Tu_day, July 5-1955

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Tuesday, July 5, the first Monday, being a holiday. Called to order at 8 oclock P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Bettis, City Engineer Tatone, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Hill, Hulbert and Kraft. Absent, Beck & Oathes. The minutes of the regular meeting of June 6 and recessed of June 22 were read and approved.

The Mayor then called for the quarterly report of the City Treasurer, which after being read and on motion by Hill, seconded and carried, declared approved subject to audit by the finance committee.

It then appearing, that in answer to the City's "Call for Bids" recently published, Mr. R.F.Thomas from the Addressograph Corporation and Mr. Art Lind representing Abbott and Lind were present, the Mayor asked them to address the Council.

Both men then presented bids on Addressograph machines, extolling the advantages of each; after questions and answers and some discussion, it was decided to postpone any action until a full meeting of the Council could be obtained .

The matter of purchasing a new fire pump was then bro't up and Mr. John Schultz of Roney's Inc. and George Neep from the Neep Equipment Co., being present, both talked in favor of their respective pumps.No action was taken at this time, it being advisable to first call for bids.

Communications

From Secretary of State announcing the fact that the recent census count had been officially established, showing the population of Canby as 2035 inhabitants.

From the Blue Cross Hospital Service announcing the cancellation of the City's contract as of May 31, 1955.

From the Christian & Missionart Alliance requesting favorable action by the Council in approving the necessary repair and adjustment of service lines in keeping with our electric requirements".

From the City Planning Commission, suggesting that the City adopt the so-called "Building Code for Small Cities"; also that an ordinance be passed relative to proper drainage where driveways interfere with such.

From the Housing and Home Finance Agency, Office of the Regional Adminstrator of the Federal Government, stating that the funds advanced for the Sewer Project should be returned on or before August 8, 1955.

It was then moved by Hulbert, seconded by Kraft and carried that a payment of \$ 203.50 be paid the Canby Business and Professional Women's Club for its services in supplying workers for taking the census, this sum representing .10 per inhabitant as turned in.

In this connection the Recorder was asked to write to both the Women's Club and to Mrs Myra Weston, exressing the appreciation of the Council for their excellent work and organization in handling the above.

Reports

Fire Chief Christiansen submitted reports covering the Fire Department and Ambulance activities as follows:

Two city calls on June 9th. and 16th - damage to City's Tar Kettle - \$ 75.00 One rural call on June 10-Virgil Allen dwelling-Loss \$ 7500-Insurance \$ 5000. Eight ambulance calls from 5/21 to 6/20-Financial report showing \$ 2334.12.

Police report by Officer Johnson showing mileage 2217-gas consumed 246.1 gals. Citations, warning tickets, accident investigations and various other activities, but with no outstanding occurances.

The Recorder reported 35 convictions in his Court resulting in fines of \$ 177.50, costs \$ 43.75 -net \$ 133.75.

It was then moved by Hill, seconded by Hulbert and carried, that the Fire Pump committee (Kraft-Anderson and Beck) be asked to draw up specifications and insert in the Canby Herald, "Call for Bids" for new or used pump.

It was then moved by Hill, seconded by Hulbert and carried, that the Council go on record by a statement to be published in the Canby Herald, to the effect that the City of Canby is in no way connected with the proposal to construct a mausoleum near Zion Memorial Park.
