

Regul. Monthly Meeting
Tuesday, Sept. 6-1955

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Tuesday, Sept. 6 and was called to order at 8.10 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Bettis, City Engineer Tatone, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and all councilmen.

The minutes of the previous meeting of August 1 were read and approved.

Communications

From the Public Utilities Commissioner announcing a public hearing to be held on Sept. 27, relative to the matter of fixing and regulating speed of Railway trains within the limits of cities of less than 100,00 population

From the City Planning Commission recommending that the City Attorney be asked to prepare an amendment to the city charter allowing occupational licensing.

From Police Officer Fred Johnson presenting his resignation .

Reports
reported

Fire Chief Christiansen reported four city calls and six rural fire calls during the month, no damage resulting-all brush and grass fires .

Also reported the ambulance being used on six occasions between the dates of July 26 and August 16 inc. Financial report showing contributions of \$ 40.00-expenses \$ 58.06, bank balance \$ 2396.24 .

Police Dept. report showed car mileage 2353 miles, gas used 310.9 gals., also tickets issued, warnings given, assistance to State and County officers and various other activities.

The Recorder reported 41 cases in Court resulting in fines of \$ 243.50, costs \$ 60.00-net \$ 183.50 .

Councilman Oathes reported looking for man to replace Officer Johnson, but with out results as yet-also suggested that Officer Kleve was entitled to raise of \$ 10 per month as of July first, in accordance with previous understanding. This was approved and so ordered.

Councilman Beck stated that the Cemetery was in very fair condition and that his committee had met and considered the many applications for the job of caretaker. He stated that three had been selected, as the most promising and suggested that a special meeting be called and the three be requested to be present.

Engineer Tatone then presented revised plans for sewer lines, received from the engineers and stated that many test holes had been drilled, showing more or less rock. After lengthy discussion, he was asked to contact them by 'phone and arrange for them to meet with the Council at an early date, preferably, Tuesday or Wd. Sept. 13 or 14th. (13th. fixed later).

Atty. Bettis then reported having had title research made covering the 8 odd acres adjacent to the old power plant and offered for sale by the County.

He stated that there were complications in the title, which should be checked up. In this connection, it was moved by Oathes, seconded by Hulbert and carried, that Bettis be authorized, after being satisfied as to title, to purchase the property for the City on the terms offered by the County.

ORDINANCE

Ordinance No. 390 was read for the first time, passed and ordered posted in three separate and conspicuous places within the limits of Canby and to come up for final action on October 3 the next regular meeting of the City Council.

Said ordinance approving the preparation of and directing the execution of a contract between the City of Canby and the Weyerhaeuser Timber Company for the exchange of electrical facilities owned by the Weyerhaeuser Timber Co. and water facilities owned by the City.

It was then moved by Hulbert, seconded by Oathes and carried, that the City Atty. be authorized to draw up and ordinance similar to the so called Green River ordinance.

It was also moved by Hulbert, seconded by Oathes and carried, that the City Atty. be authorized to prepare an ordinance adopting the Building Code for small cities similar to that suggested by the League of Oregon Cities.

It was then moved by Hulbert, seconded by Hill and Carried, that the City Atty. be authorized to prepare a charter amendment to allow the City to tax business houses, professions, crafts and occupations.

It was then moved by Hulbert, seconded by Kraft and carried, that the Stefani Lumber Company be notified that unless the job of floor covering for the rear office in the City Hall was completed on or prior to Sept. 15, their bid would be rejected and the offer of the next lower bidder be accepted.
