

Regular Monthly Meeting  
Monday, Octo. 3-1955

The City Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, Octo. 3 and was called to order at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Bettis, City Engineer Tatone, Fire Chief Norman Christiansen, City Treasurer Johnson, the Recorder and the following Councilmen-Anderson, Beck, Hill, Hulbert and Oathes.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of Sept. 6 and those of the special of Sept. 13 were read and approved.

The Mayor then called for the Treasurer's report and City Treasurer Johnson then read his report covering the quarter ending September 30.

Whereupon it was moved by Beck, seconded by Oathes and carried, that the report be accepted subject to audit by the finance committee.

Auditors Report.

Roger D. Derr then submitted and read his report of examination of the books and accounts, covering the period from July 1-1954 to July 1-1955.

The audit seemed to be very complete and satisfactory and no criticisms were forthcoming.

Reports

Fire Chief Christiansen reported three City and three Rural calls in September, with no damages to speak of.

Also reported ambulance in service on eight occasions between August 18 and Sept. 20 - Financial statement shows contributions of \$ 202.00, expenses \$ 11.50-bank balance \$ 2586.74 as of Sept. 20.

Police reported car mileage 1955-gas purchase 250.3 gals. usual activities.

Recorder reported 25 convictions resulting in fines of \$ 158.00-costs \$ 38.75.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Anderson and carried that Vernon White be appointed on the police force on a trial basis for thirty days at \$ 290.00 per month, plus \$ 10.00 account allowance for uniform; also that the Recorder be instructed to write to the mayors of Salem, Silverton and Molalla, asking for information as to their experience with White when he served on the force in those cities; also, that, in the meantime, it be advertised that other applications will be received.

Sewer matters

Chas. Bayles from the office of Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merryfield, then presented the revised sewer plans, in accordance with the understanding as of the Sept. 13 special meeting. The Council then proceeded to check over the plans and specifications with Mr. Bayles and the following motion was introduced:

" Moved by Hill, seconded by Oathes, that the plans and specifications as revised by the engineering firm of Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merryfield under cover date of October 1-1955, be approved as submitted and that " calls for bids" be published in the Canby Herald in three weekly publications beginning with the October 6th. issue; also in three weekly publications of the Daily Journal of Commerce and stating that bids will be opened after 8 o'clock P.M. on October 31-1955 at a special meeting of the City Council, called for that purpose". Carried.

ORDINANCES

No. 390

This Ordinance coming up for final action was read by Atty. Bettis and on motion by Beck, seconded by Oathes and carried, was declared passed on final reading and adopted. Roll call-Yeas 5 nays 0 . ( Westinghouse contract.)

Ordinance No. 391

This ordinance, similar to the so-called " Green River" ordinance, was then introduced, read by Atty. Bettis and on motion by Beck, seconded by Hulbert and carried, declared passed on first reading, ordered posted in the legally required manner and to come up for final action at the next regular meeting of the Council to be held on November 7, 1955.

Ordinance No. 392

This Ordinance ( Building Code for small cities ) was then introduced, read by Atty. Bettis and on motion by Hulbert, seconded by Hill and carried, subject to fire zone changes in boundaries, declared passed on first reading, ordered posted in the prescribed legal manner and to come up for final action at the next regular meeting of the Council to be held on November 7, 1955.

Mayor Eversole then asked the Cemetery Committee for their report and recommendations as to the future conduct of the Cemetery. The report was then presented by Chairman Beck and on motion by Oathes, seconded by Beck and carried, was adopted and ordered made a part of these minutes :

Minutes of the Meeting of the Cemetery Committee  
City of Canby  
September 20, 1955

Present: Chairman Beck, Councilmen Anderson and Hulbert  
Guests: Mr. Everson from the Blaesing Granite Company and Jack Kent, Canby Funeral Director. Mr. Everson read contract of Blaesing Granite Company to City of Canby on sale of monuments at the Zion Cemetery, also including setting of monuments. Copy of contract attached.

Contract referred to City attorney, Bettis for his examination. Discussion concerning wages, hours, and working conditions of cemetery sexton concluded with these recommendations:

1. Wages - \$300.00 per month-- review in six months  
The revenue from cemetery to come to City of Canby
2. Working agreement - Forty-four hours per week--  
Monday through Saturday noon. No Sunday burials.  
No sexton on duty Sundays or holidays except on Memorial Day.

The following are duties of the sexton.

1. To work on records with city recorder.
2. To be present and make complete grave set-up ,  
including raising of a tent for each burial.
3. To take care of grounds.
4. Set up monuments as soon as possible, weather permitting.
5. Report to City Council at every monthly meeting the activities at the cemetery.

It is recommended that the cemetery be inspected monthly by the City Commissioner of Cemetery and Parks.

It was then moved by Hulbert, seconded by Anderson and carried, that Clayton Yoder be employed as caretaker of the Cemetery at a salary of \$ 300 per month and under the conditions as set out in the above report.

It was furthermore moved by Oathes, seconded by Hill and carried, that the Cemetery Committee be authorized to handle the renting of the buildings and grounds adjacent.

Councilman Oathes then reported having attended the meeting in Salem of the Public Utilities Commission as to the speed of S.P. trains through the City.

Mr. Oathes stated that he had registered an objection against the speed of 79 miles per hour, as favored by the Commission. Was told that the matter would be taken up at another hearing.
