

Regular Monthly Meeting  
Monday, March 7-1955

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday, March 7 and called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Bettis, City Engineer Tatone, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Hill, Hulbert, Kraft and Oathes.

The minutes of the previous meeting of Febr. 7 were read and approved.

The regular order of business was then suspended and the Mayor extended an invitation to speak to visitors, who were present in considerable numbers.

Rev. Paul Roth then addressed the Council to the effect that the Canby Ministerial Association was much opposed to the granting of a "liquor by the drink" license and also presenting a petition signed by a large number of citizens, also expressing their disapproval of the same.

Other speakers in the same vein were Rev. Lambert, Rev. Harris, Ralph Dawes, Albin Erickson and Mrs. Henry Kraft.

Mayor Eversole assured the visitors that the matter would be given consideration.

The Council then gave its attention to the opening of bids for a new truck body and derrick, in response to a "Call for bids" recently published.

Bids were received from the Schetky Equipment Corporation, American Truck Equip. Co. Douglas Hood Co. and the Pacific Body Builders, Inc.

After consideration it was decided that the bid of the Schetky Equip. Corp. was the most favorable in meeting the requirements as outlined in the "call for bids" and on motion by Anderson, seconded by Beck and carried, it was voted to accept their bid of \$ 3916.30 covering body and all equipment, including the large size winch.

#### Communications

The Recorder then read the following communications :

From Mr. & Mrs. Luginbill, Ralph Dawes and Mrs. Effie Nelson, all expressing disapproval of the granting of a liquor license as above mentioned.

From Harold M. Black, Co. Ext. Agent, thanking the Council for use of the City Hall for the February 14 meeting.

From the State Highway Dept. relative to the matter of applying for funds to improve streets. ( In this connection, the Recorder was asked to send for application blanks.)

#### Reports

Fire Chief Christiansen reported three city calls and two rural since last report. Nine ambulance calls during the same period. Financial statement showing a balance of \$ 2179.60 on hand.

The usual police department report was submitted by Officer Johnson, showing the various activities during the month.

The Recorder reported 48 cases in Court resulting in fines assessed of \$ 294.00, costs \$ 66.75-net \$ 227.25 . *Costs To Run License*

Atty. Bettis then explained to the Council the difficulties he was having in obtaining easements for the sewer lines, in some cases property owners absolutely refusing access to their property.

In this connection it was suggested that Atty. Bettis and Engineer Tatone cooperate with Tom Gerber in formulating a publication for the Canby Herald, explaining to the public and property owners interested, the obstacles appearing, and asking for their co-operation and assistance in the matter.

It was then moved by Oathes, seconded by Anderson and carried, that in the matter of a treatment plant site, the City Attorney be instructed to make an offer of \$ 500 to Collins for a tract of land 300 X 300 feet; this being the same property offered by T. Collins for \$ 2500.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Kraft and carried, that the contract with the Rural Fire Protection District that expired Dec. 8-1954, be extended for another five year period, subject to approval of the R.F.P.D.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 388

City Attorney Bettis then introduced Ordinance #388, an ordinance drawn for the purpose of purchasing from Hazel Vinyard a certain tract of land situated on N.E. Second Avenue, for the sum of \$ 1700.

On motion by Beck, seconded by Oathes and carried, said ordinance was passed on its first reading, ordered posted and to come up for final action at the next regular meeting of the Council to be held on Monday, April 4, 1955.

On roll call-Yeas 6-nays 0.

It was then moved by Hill, seconded by Beck and carried, that the sum of \$ 1200 be transferred from the Water Sinking Fund to the General Fund as a loan to be applied on the purchase of the new police car.
