

Regular Monthly Meeting
Monday April, 4-1955

The Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, April 4 and was called to order at 8.10 o'clock, P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, City Atty. Bettis, City Engineer Tatone, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Hill, Hulbert, Kraft and Oathes.

The minutes of the previous meetings of March 7 and 21st. were read and approved.

City Treasurer Johnson then submitted and read his report for the first quarter of the current year and on motion, seconded and carried it was declared accepted, subject to audit by the finance committee.

Communications.

Under this head, the Recorder read a letter from the Planning Commission, in which it was recommended that a census of the population of the City be taken to determine its growth since the last count in 1950. It was also recommended that a signal be installed at the Elm Street crossing of the S.P. tracks.

Councilman Beck then introduced a Mr. Persen, who represented a company in the business of erecting mausoleums in cemeteries and who suggested that it would be an improvement for Zion Cemetery. After questioning Mr. Persen as to the details of his plan and some discussion, he was told that the matter would be taken under consideration.

Reports of Officers and others

Police Officer Johnson submitted the usual report covering the activities of the department during March-no outstanding incidents.

The Recorder reported 27 cases in Court, resulting in fines of \$ 217.00, costs \$ 48.50-net \$ 168.50.

Fire Chief Christiansen reported four city calls, with no damages; two rural calls-damages estimated \$ 250.00 to brooder house on the Paul Suhrbier place.

He also reported ten calls for the ambulance during the period from Febr. 18 to March 15 inc. Ambulance fund in bank-\$ 2241.33.

City Engineer Tatone then stated that he had been obtaining some figures on a "Tarpot" and in this connection, it was moved by Hill, seconded by Anderson and carried, that he be authorized to purchase one, plus the necessary equipment.

Tatone also submitted a bid of the Canby Paint Center (\$98.78) for painting the two offices and hall in the City building, and on motion by Hulbert, seconded by Hill and carried, it was accepted.

Whereupon the matter of taking a census, adopting a new building code and other matters recommended by the Planning Commission were discussed and on motion by Oathes, seconded by Beck and carried, the Recorder was instructed to order from the League of Oregon Cities 12 copies of a "Building Code" suitable for small cities.

It then appearing that the Stefani mill was no longer operating and that complaints had been made by various citizens as to the conditions prevailing there, it was moved by Hulbert, seconded by Anderson and carried, that the Recorder write the owners, asking for a general cleanup.

Atty. Bettis then reported having some difficulty with the Koehler estate in securing sewer easements, it being necessary to obtain rights from the various heirs and the Portland bank handling the estate.

He also added that Sandsness was not willing to assume the cost of cast iron pipe or any other expense in connection with the proposed sewer under his buildings.

Whereupon, it was moved by Hill, seconded by Kraft and carried, that Sandsness requirements be met.

Atty. Bettis then stated that a sewer easement would be granted by Percy Stolze for the sum of \$ 100.00 and on motion by Oathes, seconded by Beck and carried, it was voted to allow the same, providing Stolze^{sign} a regular form of easement, with the privileges granted any other connectors.

Councilman Kraft then reported that he and Councilman Oathes had met with the Rural Fire District directors and discussed the idea of a combination Police-Ambulance and Rural Fire 'phone station with no particular results.

Mayor Eversole then stated that he would at this time designate the week from April 18-23 as "Clean-up" week.

ORDINANCE NO. 388

Ordinance No. 388 authorizing the purchase from Hazel Vinyard of real estate property on N.E. Third Avenue at a price of \$ 1700. was then read by Atty Bettis and on motion by Beck, seconded by Oathes and carried, was declared passed on its final reading and adopted. Roll call-Yeas 6 nays 0.

It was then moved by Hill, seconded by Kraft and carried, that funds for payment of above should be made from the Sewer Sinking Fund and a method of repayment be worked out by the Finance Committee.

Councilman Oathes then spoke of the importance of a warning signal at the railroad crossing at Elm street, known to be hazardous, and thought some action should be taken in the matter.

Whereupon it was moved by Oathes, seconded by Beck and carried, that a letter be written to L.P.Hopkins, Supt. of the Southern Pacific in Portland, calling his attention to the above mentioned condition and requesting some remedy.

It was then moved by Hill, seconded by Oathes and carried, that the application of Cutsforth Market to the State Liquor Commission for the privilege of selling package beer, be approved by the Council and officially signed.
