

Regular Monthly Meeting
Monday, May 2-1955

The City Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, May 2 and was called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present-Mayor Eversole, Atty. Bettis, City Engineer Tatone, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Hill, Hulbert and Oathes. Absent Kraft.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of April 4 and those of the recessed meeting of April 18 were read and approved.

The regular order of business was then suspended and Ralph Roderick submitted and read the recommendations of the engineers in the matter of the proposed sewer installation. It was thought the plant bid (\$ 39308.00) made by Lind should be accepted, but as to the sewer lines, there were three alternatives- (1) accept the lowest of the bids submitted, (2) re-advertise, (3) revise the plans to provide for shallower excavations.

After a lengthy discussion, it was decided to defer any action until May 11th., when another meeting would be held.

Communications.

From the County Fair Board to the Mayor asking for a representation at a dinner to be held at the Bolton Grade School at 6.30 P.M., May 12, for the purpose of talking over plans for improving the 1955 Fair.

From the S.P.Co. stating that a representative would meet with the Council or a committee at any time, relative to a signaling device at the Elm street crossing.

Also from the S.P.Co. enclosing agreement relative to underground pipe line at Knott st.

From S.I.A.C. announcing workmen's contribution of one cent per day, increased to two cents and volunteer firemen from 30cents per month to .60 cents.

From Chamber of Commerce urging adoption of the "Green River" ordinance.

From the Planning Commission announcing their approval of the Arestad-Drayer Addition located adjacent to the West property line of North Locust Street and the North line of the city limits.

Reports

Officer Johnson submitted the usual report of Police activities during the month, the same being accepted and placed on file.

The Recorder reported 23 cases in Court for April, resulting in fines of \$ 170.00, costs \$ 39.00-net \$ 131.00.

Fire Chief Christiansen reported one City and two fire calls during April, with no losses to mention. In the period from March 19 to and inclusive of April 15, the ambulance responded to eight calls and the financial statement submitted showed as follows:

The Chief also stated that the annual training school would be held the latter part of May and intimated that an allowance from the City would be welcome to cover expenses of those attending. He also requested to be allowed to purchase a power mower for the Fire Hall grounds and two nozzles for hose.

In the matter of a proposed new police call set-up, Councilman Oathes reported that a direct 'phone line connection to the Oregon City police switchboard can be leased for \$ 63.50 per month. He also stated that he had talked with Captain Newman who assured him that such a hookup would be agreeable and that calls could be handled at all hours with prompt service.

It was then moved by Oathes, seconded by Beck and carried, that the local 'phone company be requested to proceed with the installation of such above mentioned line.

It was furthermore moved by Hill, seconded by Beck and carried that the cut over to the new system when ready, be left in the hands of Councilman Oathes.

Councilman Beck then stated that the Lions Club wanted permission to erect a loud speaker stand, also lunch stand in Wait Park.

Whereupon, on motion by Oathes, seconded by Anderson and carried, the request was granted.
