

Regu' Monthly Meeting
Monday, May 3, 1954

The Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, May 3 and was called to order at 8.19 o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, City Atty. Bettis, City Engineer Tatone, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Hill, Hulbert and Kraft, and Girod.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of April 5, the special of April 13 and the recessed meeting of April 26 were read and approved.

Communications

From the League of Oregon Cities, enclosing statement of league dues (\$66.84) to be included in the 1954-55 budget; also stating that the membership now consisted of 209 member cities, the highest on record.

Petitions

A petition signed by Virgil Giger and others was presented asking that when and if sidewalks were constructed on the Knight's Bridge Road, between North Grant street and Ferry Road adjacent to their properties, that it be ordered that walks and curbs shall abut each other.

Whereupon, on motion by Girod, seconded by Anderson and carried, it was voted that the above request be allowed as to the North side of the street mentioned.

Reports

City Engineer Tatone presented his report of April activities in each department, a copy of which was handed each councilman and one for the files.

The usual report of the police department was furnished by Officer McCormick.

The Recorder reported 14 cases in Court in April, resulting in fines amounting to \$ 217.00, costs \$ 44.00-net \$ 177.00.

Fire Chief Christiansen reported one City call in April with no loss, also two Rural calls, one near Pat's Acres resulting in total loss of shack and contractor's tools. The other no damage.

He also reported seven ambulance calls from March 19 to April 18 inc. also presented financial statement showing balance on hand in bank amounting to \$ 1526.40.

Mayor Eversole then stated that he would designate May 10 to 15 as "Clean-up-Week".

He, also with the approval of the Council set May 25 As the date for the Budget Meeting to be held in the council chambers at 8 o'clock P.M.

It was then moved by Girod, seconded and carried that the sum of \$ 150.00 be allowed the Fire Department for expenses for those wishing to attend the annual convention at Baker.

Councilman Hill then bro't up the matter of increased charges for water meter installations, recommending new charges of \$ 85 for one inch and \$ 50 for 3/4 inch.

It was decided to table this for one month, until the next regular meeting.

Council Anderson reporting for the committee on purchases of gasoline asked for more time, in order to investigate actions in other places.

Councilman Kraft reported repairs on new Fire Hall nearly completed and some work done on landscaping, lawns and shrubs.

The idea of purchasing equipment for better protection of books and records was then discussed, but no action taken.

It was then moved by Anderson, seconded by Kraft and carried, that the Mayor appoint a committee to recommend, if thought desirable, amendments to Ordinance No. 317, and ordinance relating to licensing various trades and occupations.

Mayor Eversole proceeded to appoint Messrs. Hulbert, Anderson and Kraft as such committee.

Atty. Bettis reported that he had investigated the condition of the Wilkinson Mill property and found no assets. He suggested that a letter be forwarded to Walter Fisher, Trustee and copies to Ben and Roy Wilkinson, calling their attention to the millpond hazard and demanding drainage within ten days. (letter sent 5-4-54)

It then appearing that there had been some criticism as to the use of some of the city equipment, on motion by Beck, seconded by Anderson and carried, it was decided that city equipment should be used only for municipal purposes.
