Repulard Monthly Meeting . .day, June 7-1954

The Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, June 7 and was called to order at 8.05 o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Bettis, City Engineer Tatone, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Hill, Hulbert, Johnson and Kraft.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of May 3 and those of the special meetings of May 22 and 25 were read and approved.

The Mayor then announced a suspension of the regular order of business in order to listen to Mr. Howland, who had been asked to attend the meeting, with the idea of talking over and advising, relative to future action, if any, with respect to the sewer matter, which had been defeated at the recent election.

During the interview with Mr. Howland, the water situation was also presented, it being suggested that it would be a proper time in the summer months to make a study of same, both as to increased supply and greater reserve capacity. Mr. Howland thought this could be done at a cost of approximately \$ 350.00.

Whereupon it was moved by Hill, seconded by Beck and carried, that the firm of Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merryfield be employed to make a study of Canby's water system and submit recommendations.

It was then moved by Hill, seconded by Kraft, that police services, more particularly assistance in parking, be furnished for the Gladiolus show to be held in the Fairgrounds on August 7 and 8. Carried.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Hill and carried, that the playground equipment, recently installed in Wait Park, be accepted from the American Legion and the City to assume sole ownership; also that the Recorder forward a letter of thanks and appreciation to the Legion chapter.

It was then moved by Hill, seconded by Kraft and carried, that the members of the election boards, employed at the recent election, be paid \$ 2.00 each for their services.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Hill and carried, that the action of the Council at the meeting on April 5-1954, relative to the advanced price of graves and lots in Zion Cemetery be rescinded.

Whereupon Councilman Beck, seconded by Kraft moved that the following prices prevail in the future:

Also that \$ 15.00 of the price of each grave and \$ 5.00 of the price of each opening to be placed in a sinking fund for perpetual care. Carried.

Councilman Johnson then suggested the installation of more street lights and on motion, seconded and carried the purchase of 12 more Mercury-Vapor lights was authorized, to be installed during the calendar year.

Mayor Eversole then announced that at this time he would make the following committee changes on account of the resignation of Mr. Girod.

> Finance Committee to be Kraft (Chr.) Anderson and Johnson Salaries & wages - Hill, Anderson and Johnson

It was then moved by Anderson, seconded by Hill and carried, that the amount due the Rural Fire District as the City's share (one-half interest) for the new Fire Hall lot be paid , the amount being \$ 1145.00 .

It then being reported that the overhead signal light at the intersection of 99E and Ivy street was not working properly, the Recorder was instructed to notify the State Highway Department to that effect.

Councilman Beck then called the attention of the Council to the fact that hard ball was being played at times in Wait Park by older boys and adults, the park not being adaptable for that purpose, except by the younger element.

Whereupon it was moved by Anderson, seconded and carried, that Messrs. Beck and Johnson be asked to draw up rules and regulations and have same printed and posted. It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Kraft and carried, that Mr. G.C. Decker be given permission to remove a certain Locust tree near the corner of N.W Third and Holly streets.

Ordinance No. 383

Ordinance No. 383, providing for a City Planning Commission was then introduced, passed on first reading, ordered posted and to come up for final action at the next regular meeting of the Council to be held on Tuesday, July 6, 1954.
