# Regular Monthly Meeting Tur 'ay, July 6, 1954

The Council met in regular monthly session on Tuesday, July 6, the previous Monday having fallen on a holiday.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Bettis (very late), City Engineer Tatone, the Recorder and Councilmen Hill, Hulbert, Johnson and Kraft.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of June 7 and those of the special of June 21 were read and approved.

City Treasurer Johnson then submitted and read his quarterly report for the period ending June 30 and on motion by Hill semonded by Johnson it was accepted subject to audit by the finance committee.

M.A.Larsen and others then presented a petition asking that Oscar Cripps be refused a permit for building a small barn on his premises andmore or less adjacent to the signers of the petition. On adjice of the City Attorney, it was decided that no action should be taken in the matter at this time.

F.R. Galbraith then asked that he be allowed to take his annual vacation, the same being granted providing he make arrangements for carying on by some one in his absense.

### Other Reports

The Recorder reported 15 cases in Court during the past month resulting in fines of \$ 260.50-costs \$ 56.00-net \$ 204.50.

Fire Chief Christiansen reported three calls in the City, being small fires with very little damages resulting.

One rural call to the Roy Hale property, with damages of about \$ 100.00. Also reported 15 ambulance calls since his last report. Contributions received amounted to \$ 333.77 and expenses \$ 4.34 leaving a balance in the fund of \$ 1924.20. An annual report showed 95 calls and contributions of \$ 1314.24, expenses \$ 660.07. Chief Christiansen also stated that one of the trucks was out of commission, the pump having gone bad and estimated a new one would cost about \$ 1800.00. He also gave a verbal report of the recent convention held at Bend and the County meeting at Canby.

Councilman Kraft reported moisture showing thro' the walls of the new Fire Hall, which would need attention, as well as some painting. He was requested to get estimates of expense and report back.

Councilman Hill then announced that it would be necessary to extend the water main west on the old Highway and he moved that the City Engineer be instructed to extend a four inch pipe line from the corner of S.W. 4th. and Birch to the N.E. corner of the Bob Torgeson property, with proper hydrants installed. The above motion was seconded by Kraft and carried and so ordered.

Chairman Hill of the Wage and Salary committee then stated that his committee together with City Engineer had recently met and came up with the following recommendations:

It was then moved by Johnson, second by Hulbert that above recommendations be approved. Carried and so ordered.

The Council then acted unfavorably on a request by Ruby Schmidt for the privilege of sinking an oil tank under the sidewalk adjacent to his new building at the corner of N.W. 2nd Avenue and Grant sts. and the Recorder was instructed to write him to that effect.

Engineer Tatone then bro't up the matter of Don Stajgr'd sidewalk, which he anticipated laying at his residence at 573 So. Lucust, but owing to the closeness of his house to the street wished to advance it to what would be street property.

It was decided that if layed at the present time, it should be on his own property or he could wait until the Planning Commission could investigate as to the proper width of the street.

Atty. Bettis then presented to the Council for their consideration, a deed signed by E.H.Thornton and wife, conveying to the City for street purposes, a strip of ground along his property on N.W. 6th. Avenue. Before accepting the transfer, Councilman Kraft was asked to contact directors of S/D 86 for the purpose of obtaining, if possible, a strip off the northerly boundary of school property, sufficient to make a 40 foot street.

#### ORDINANCE

Ordinance No. 383 creating a Planning Commission and defining its duties was read by Atty. Bettis, placed on its final passage and on motion by Hulbert, seconded by Hill and carried, declared adopted. On roll call-Yeas 4, nays 0. Mayor Eversole then stated that he would appoint Messrs. Hulbert and Johnson as council members of the Planning Commission.

#### Communications

From the Canby Pioneer Cemetery Association asking that the City take over and maintain the old Pioneer Cemetery on Knight's Bridge Road.

No action was taken in the matter, except that the Mayor stated that he would consult with Councilman Beck.

From the Bonneville Power Administration advising of meetings to be held to discuss various problems and extending invitation to attend; the first one to be held at the Multhomah Hotel on July 26.
