

Regular Monthly Meeting  
Monday, August 2-1954

The Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, August 2 and was called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: On roll call-Mayor Eversole, Atty Bettis, City Eng. Tatone, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Hulbert, Johnson, Kraft. Hill reporting later.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of July 6 and special of July 26 were read and approved.

Communications

From the State Highway Dept. acknowledging receipt of request for aid from the Special City Allotment Fund and stating that the request would be considered at a later date.

From Piepenbrink and Kron, Public Accountants, submitting a bid of \$ 465 as their fee for auditing the City books.

From the Portland Road and Driveway Co. submitting figures for oiling and patching streets.

Petition.

Signed by four property owners asking for paving to be installed on N.E. 5th. from Ivy st. east to Juniper.

In connection with this, it was moved by Hulbert, seconded by Beck and carried, that the City Atty. be asked to draw up an ordinance to be submitted to the Council. Roll call, Yeas 6, nays 0 .

Marion Garmire then appeared before the Council, stating that he had recently discovered that his dwelling at No. 741 Holly st. was partly located in a dedicated public road and wanted to know what could be done about it.

After some discussion it was decided to leave the matter up to the Planning Commission to work out the answer.

Reports

Officer McCormick submitted the usual report of police activities for the month, showing arrests made, warnings given, investigations and other minor matters.

The Recorder reported nine cases in Court during the previous month, resulting in fines assessed amounting to \$ 62.50-Costs \$ 15.00.

Fire Chief Christiansen reported one City fire on July 10 , it being a So. Pacific outfit car-damage estimated at \$ 650.

Rural call on July 24-grass fire, no damage.

Also ten ambulance calls and contributions during the month amounting to \$ 30.00, expenses \$ 37.28, bank balance \$ 1916.92.

Mayor Eversole then announced that he would set the date of August 11 for the first meeting of the Planning Commission- for organization, election of officers, etc.

It was then moved by Hulbert, seconded by Kraft and carried, that the Council go on record as being willing and prepared to cooperate with the Planning Commission in every way possible and that the Mayor so inform that body.

Councilman Johnson then reported having received various prices on a pole dolly, which he submitted to the Council and following some discussion, it was moved by Hill, seconded by Hulbert and carried, that he, together with Councilman Anderson and Engineer Tatone be authorized to purchase same.

Council Hill of the Salaries and Wage committee then submitted his report and recommendations, the same being included in these minutes;(see following page.)

On motion by Beck, seconded by Kraft and carried, it was voted to adopt the recommendations .

It was then moved by Kraft, seconded by Hill and carried, that Ted Kent be employed to audit the City books as of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1954 and to be paid the sum of \$ 300 for his work.

On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were allowed and warrants ordered drawn. Roll call-Yeas 5-nays 0.

To the Honorable Mayor and members of the Canby City Council.

The wage and salary committee, before making any recommendations for wage adjustments wish to make this explanation a matter of record for the City employees to refer to.

When the budget committee makes up the budget for the next fiscal year they attempt to forecast the cost of running the City government for that period and appropriate the necessary funds. They in no way attempt to set wages as that is strictly a Council matter. Just because there is a slight surplus set up for one department or another does not mean that this sum should be immediately used in increasing wages so that the whole amount budgeted will be used up. If that were the case it would be a simple matter to balance the budget if funds were short, by merely cutting employees wages the necessary amount to make it balance.

It is the opinion of the committee that having a slight surplus in any department is a healthy condition and could easily be used in case of injury or serious illness to any of the regular employees, necessitating the hiring of additional help.

With this thought in mind the committee wishes to make the following wage adjustment recommendations to the City Council and if any of the suggestions be adopted they become effective as of July 1, 1954.

RONALD TATONE, City engineer, be paid \$435.00 per month, an increase of \$420.00 per year.  
*Harry Evans, City recorder be paid \$100.00 per month, an increase of \$200.00 per year.*  
 MRS. DECKER, bookkeeper, be paid \$270.00 per month, an increase of \$120.00 per year.

Regarding the salary of the bookkeeper, the committee feels that in view of existing conditions and the amount of City business transacted at the present time, no further increase in salary for this position will be warranted.
