Regular Monthly Meeting Mond Octo. 4-1954

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday, October 4, 1954 and called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Bettis, City Engineer Tatone, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Hill and Hulbert.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of September 7, recessed to Sept. 13 and continued were read and approved.

City Treasurer Johnson then presented and read his report for the quarter ending Sept. 30, the same, on motion, seconded and carried, being approved, subject to audit by the finance committee.

Victor Plamondon then presented an application to the Oregon Liquor Commission, for the privilege of selling package beer, asking for its approval by the Council. On motion by Anderson, seconded by Beck and carried, approval was granted.

Communications

Letter received from the Planning Commission heartily endorsing the provisions embodied in Ordinance No. 385, and recommending certain street changes in the vicinity of the High School, owing to the ground to be taken up by new building construction. (see complete letter in files)

Communication from D.E.Wright, representative of Remington-Rand, calling attention to our unprotected books and files, in case of fire, and urging purchase of a new safe and other Remington-Rand equipment.

Reports

Engineer Tatone submitted his report, a copy to each member, showing the activities in each department during the preceding month. (see copy in files).

The Police Dept. reported on gas consumed, and mileage used by the police car; also arrests, warnings, investigations, assistance given, etc.

The Recorder reported 27 cases tried in Court, resulting in fines assessed amounting to \$ 549.50-costs \$ 109.59 -net \$ 440.00.

Fire Chief Christiansen reported na calls, either City or Rural since last report. In the ambulance report-11 runs -contributions \$ 131.50-expenses \$ 16.45, bank balance of \$ 2051.11.

Principal Chas. MacKenzie of the Canby High School then addressed the Council relative to proposed changes in the use of some streets adjacent to the school buildings and the matter of new parking facilities, all of which appears necessary by reason of more building to be done in the near future.

Whereupon it was moved by Anderson, seconded by Hill and carried, that, in line with the Planning Commission recommendations and cooperating with the High School Board, the city engineer be asked to run lines on SW Birch st. from 4th. to 5th, SW 5th. Avenue from the Shepherd property west to intersection of SW 4th.; also to estimate the approximate cost of proposed work.

Councilman Hill then reported on the proposed police car purchase, stating that it seemed advisable to delay asking for bids until such a time as more information would be available as to 1955 models and possible better bargains in 1954 cars.

Eng. Tatone submitted cost figures for Quonset Hut fixtures (\$125 each) and new 20 x 20 rest room building-approximately \$ 2000.

Councilman Beck was asked to contact Portland engineers also as to cost of building for rest rooms.

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE CANBY CITY COUNCIL

October 4, 1954

A regular meeting of the Council for the City of Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon convened in regular session at the City Hall on the 4th day of October, 1954, at the hour of 8:00 O'clock P.M., Standard Oregon Time. The following named Councilmen and City Officials were present:

Following the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting of the Council, claims against the City were read and approved.
