

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE CANBY CITY COUNCIL

October 6, 1954

The regular, recessed meeting of the Council for the City of Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon, convened in regular session at the City Hall on the 6th day of October, 1954, at the hour of 8:00 O'clock P.M., Standard Oregon Time, and for the express purpose of considering on the final reading, certain Ordinances, and in pursuance of a motion duly adopted at the regular meeting, recessed on the 4th day of October, 1954.

The following named Councilmen and City Officials were present:

Councilman Hulbert sent word that he would not be able to attend, and was absent.

Following the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting, and by way of unfinished business, Ordinances No. 380, 384, and 385 were read for the second and final time, and each in its respective order was carefully considered, and on motions duly made and seconded were unanimously approved as read.

Following the reading and approval of the aforementioned Ordinances, Councilman Hill submitted for the Council's consideration, Resolution No. 1, which called for a special election in the City for the purpose of submitting to the voters the question of amending the Charter of the City of Canby to allow the City Council to commence construction of a proposed sewer system. After the Resolution was read, and discussion had, the matter was called for a vote. Councilmen Hill, Anderson, Johnson and Kraft voted "YES" for its adoption, and Councilman Beck voted "NO". Thereupon, Mayor Eversole declared the results as being 4 in favor and 1 opposed, and since the 4 "Yays" constituted a majority of the entire Council, further declared the Resolution as having been approved by the Council. The City Recorder was then directed to proceed in accordance with the Resolution and call the special election.

There being no further business, on motion duly made and seconded, and when put to a vote, the meeting was ajourned until the next regular meeting, or until such a time as a special meeting may be called.
