

Regular Monthly Meeting
City Council of Canby, Oregon
Monday, Dec. 6-1954

The City Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, December 6, 1954 and was called to order at 8.10 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, City Atty. Bettis, City Engineer Tatone, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Hill, Hulbert, Johnson and Kraft.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of November 1 and special meetings of November 3 and 15 were read and approved.

The regular order of business was then suspended in order to listen to visitors, who might wish to leave early.

In this connection a petition asking for certain improvements on Ferry Road was presented by Aleck Collins, signed by himself and wife and other property owners.

It appearing that the district mentioned in the petition was outside the City *jurisdiction* limits, no action was taken by the Council.

Whereupon, Mr. D.E. Wright, representing the Remington Rand Co. then talked to the Council, urging the purchase of a new safe and other fire-proof equipment for the city records. No action taken.

Communications.

Letter from Gus Nozwood, Secy of the N.W. Public Power Assn. urging that Canby keep up its membership in the Association.

From the State Highway Dept. acknowledging our request for the removal of trees in front of the Girod building on 99E.

From the City Planning Commission, recommending that the so-called "Green River" Ordinance be adopted by Canby,

From E.C. Sammons, State Director for "Safe-Driving Day" asking that the Mayor issue a proclamation and that Canby cooperate in this movement.

Whereupon, it was moved by Hill, seconded by Hulbert and carried, that the Council go on record as favoring such a proclamation by the Mayor, that the same be published in the Canby Herald and that the police department be appointed to take charge of all suggested activities incidental to "Safe-Driving Day" as of December 15, 1954.

Reports

Fire Chief Christiansen reported two City calls in November and three rural calls-minor damages. Also four ambulance calls. Bank balance \$ 2077.89.

Police activities for month was submitted, read by Recorder and placed on file. The Recorder reported 37 cases in his Court, resulting in fines assessed in the amount of \$ 441.00-Costs \$ 99.50.

City Engineer Tatone then submitted a copy of his regular monthly report to each member of the Council. He also bro't up the matter of purchasing two trucks to replace the pickup and flat bed trucks now in use. No action.

The matter of an increase of salary for Floyd Galbraith, Cemetery Supt. was next presented and on recommendation of Com. Beck, any action was deferred until after January first.

In connection with the announcement that Mr. McArthur had decided to quit his job as of Jan. 1st., Mayor Eversole suggested that he be asked to come before the next meeting of the Council and the Recorder was so instructed.

The following Resolution, known as Resolution III, authorizing issuance of Sewer Bonds by the City of Canby was then introduced and on motion by Anderson, seconded by Beck and carried, declared adopted, and a call for bids ordered published in three issues of the Canby Herald, as of December 9th. 16th. and 23rd., said bids to be opened at a meeting of the Council to be held on December 29, 1954 at 8'clock P.M.
On roll call-Yeas 6, nays 0 .

The Recorder was then instructed to write Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merryfield for 25 copies of their analysis of the proposed sewer and treatment plant for the purpose of supplying same to prospective bond bidders.

ORDINANCE NO. 386

Ordinance No. 386, providing for the vacation of the North one-half of 7th. Avenue between Grant street and North Holly street was then introduced, read and on motion by Beck, seconded by Johnson and carried, declared passed on its first reading and to come up for final action at a regular meeting of the Council to be held on Monday, January 3-1955. Roll call-Yeas 6, nays 0 .

It was then moved by Hill, seconded by Anderson and carried, that Don Stajgr and Harold Ott be notified that their services would not be needed after Jan. 1-1955. Reason-lack of cooperation.
