

Recessed Meeting
Tuesday, Dec. 14.
1954

The Council met on Tuesday, Dec. 14, recessed from Dec. 6 and was called to order at 8.10 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Fire Chief Christiansen, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Hill, Hurlbert and Kraft.

Mr. McArthur, who had announced that he expected to give up his job as of Jan. first, was present at the request of the Mayor and Council.

Mr. McArthur was asked if any inducement, such as shorter hours or a helper, etc. would affect his decision in regard to the matter, but the answer was "No"; that he had made up his mind to quit at the age of 75, which event would happen on Jan. 3, 1955. That being the case, the Mayor stated that apparently nothing could be done about it, but that his services would be greatly missed.

Bids for Police Car

The Council then proceeded to open and consider the following bids received in connection with the purchase of a new Police Dept. car:

Whereupon on motion by Hill, seconded by Anderson and carried, the bid of the Oregon City Motor Co. was accepted, car to be equipped as specified in their bid dated December 14, 1954. Roll call-Yeas 4-nays 0 .

Ford V 8 2 door Police Interceptor model, recirculating heater, Vinyl trim, delivered at Canby .

The matter of finding a station to handle police and ambulance calls then came up for consideration and Councilman Kraft reported that he had contacted several service stations and some other possibilities.

The Giger Service Station would be willing to give it a 60 day trial at \$ 350 per month.

After a lengthy discussion, the Hurlbert Flower Shop offered to take on the job on a trial basis for \$ 250 per month.

Whereupon on motion by Anderson, seconded by Kraft and carried, it was voted to accept the Flower Shop offer to render the service (24 hours daily) until such a time as the matter could be put up for bids.

The Recorder then presented the application of Victor Plamondon for the privilege of selling package beer under the State liquor laws, it being necessary to have the approval of the City Government.

It was then moved by Hill, seconded by Hurlbert and carried, that the application be approved on payment of the regulation fee of \$ 5.00 and the Recorder instructed to sign and indicate the above action on the official application.

No other business appearing, on motion, seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned.
