## Regular Monthly Meeting Monday, Jan. 4-1954

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council was held om Monday, January 4 and called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, City Engineer Tatone, Fire Chief Yoder, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Girod, Hill, Hulbert and Kraft. The minutes of the previous meeting of December 7 and the recessed meeting of

December 10 were read and approved. Mayor Eversole then stated that he would call for the City Treasurer's quarterly

report at this time. City Treasurer Johnson then read his report covering receipts and disbursements of the various departments for the quarter ending December 31.

On motion, seconded and carried the report was accepted subject to audit by the Finance Committee.

It then appearing that there numerous visitors present, the Mayor stated that he would be glad to hear from anyone having something to bring up.

Roy Hampton then complained that, while the city water tank was being painted under the Hinrich contract, considerable paint had been blown on his dwelling and wanted to know what could be done about it, as he could get no satisfaction fromHinrich. He was told that Mr. Hinrich was supposed to carry liability coverage in a good company as set out in his contract covering the job. The Recorder was requested to check on Hinrich's policy and advise Hampton, in order that he might register his claim for damages, if any.

Rene DuPont then reported and turned over to the Recorder, the sum of § 108.00 collected from various merchants and to be applied on So. Pacific rent for the new parking space.

Roy Mangus stated that he had heard very favorable comments in connection with the new arrangements, but suggested that the police move slowly at first in enforcing any new parking rules that might be adopted. He also stated that it was the opinion of most First street merchants that one hour parking be allowed on both sides of the street.

In connection with the above, it was later moved by Hulbert, seconded by Beck and carried, that the following rules be adopted at present, subject to change if deemed advisable:

> On First street-parallel parking on both sides from Grant to Ivy. Cross walks to be shown at intersections of Grant and Holly and also one extending from the entrance to the new parking lot to the opposite side of First.

10 minute parking zone at Postoffice for a distance of 50 feet west. No parking for a distance of 18 feet from the west end of the south side railing between drug store and S.P.depot. Various proper signs to be erected.

#### Communications

From the State Highway Department advising that our application for funds for street improvements in 1954 had not been approved.

From the Canby Volunteer Fire Department, stating that they had chosen Norman Christenson as Fire Chief for the ensuing year and asking that the Council so appoint him.

From the Directors of the Rural Fire District asking that a committee from the Council meet with them before a fire chief is appointed.

In accordance with this request, it was decided to ask the R.F.D. board to meet with the Council on Wednesday, January 6 to discuss the matter.

### Reports of Officers

A report of police activities submitted by both officers was read by the Recorder.

The Recorder reported fines of \$32.50 paid into his Court during the past month with costs of \$7.50, leaving a net of \$25.00.

Fire Chief Yoder reported for the City 15 alarms responded to during the past year with losses estimated at \$ 650.00.

For the Rural Fire District-15 calls with estimated losses of  $\Rightarrow$  8180.00. Also that new equipment had been purchased, namely 3/4 ton panel truck and 500 feet of hose.

City Engineer submitted a monthly report covering each department, a copy of which was furnished each council member. He also suggested purchase of a new pole trailer and cab for the grader.

#### January 4-continued

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Councilman Hill then read the report and recommendations of the Wage and Salary Committee which follows :

To the Honorable Mayor and members of the Canby City Council.

On Wednesday evening, December 30th a meeting of the Wage and Salary Committee was held, presided over by chairman Al Girod. All members of the Council had been invited in order to hear Tony Ott and Don Stager present the requests of the City employees.

Wages of all City employees were reviewed and discussed at great length and from this discussion the Committee respectfully submits the following recomendations to the City Council for their further action.

First-- That all regular City employees, who so desire, be placed under the Blue Cross Hospitalization plan, the City to pay the cost for the employee only.

to pay the cost for the employee only. Second-- That the City inaugurate a sick leave plan whereby all regular employees will be allowed one day per month sick leave, which may accumulate to a period not to exceed 30 days. Any employee taking advantage of his or her sick leave shall furnish to the City Council a doctors certificate verifying said sickness.

Third-- The committee feels that in view of the above mentioned additional benefits recommended for all employees, the only wage adjustments that will be recommended at this time are to the 3 employees that have been serving a so called probationary period, which the committee feels has been served very satisfactoily:

Increase the salaries of both Police Officers from 290.00 per month to \$300.00 per month. Increase the salary of Mrs. Sledge from \$1.00

per hour to \$1.10 per hour.

The committee further recommends that if any or all of the above suggestions be adopted by the Council, they become effective as of January 1, 1954.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Hulbert and carried that the above report be accepted and the recommendations be adopted. Roll call-Yeas 6-nays 0.

It was then moved by Hill, seconded by Anderson and carried, that Engineer Tatone approve all work sheets of outside working crew and that anyone called out on overtime jobs shall receive regular 0.T. wages for the first hour or any part thereof, but any succeeding time shall be figured by 15 minute: periods.

The Recorder was then asked to send a letter of appreciation to Supt. Hopkins of the Southern Pacific Co. on account of the generous donation to the Volunteer Fire Dept. and the ambulance fund.

The Recorder was also requested to advise the Vol. Fire Dept. that a report of the ambulance activities for 1953 would be appreciated and that in the future a monthly report would be acceptable.

It was then moved by Girod, seconded by Kraft and carried, that a letter of condolence be forwarded to the family of John Eid, recently deceased.

The application of the Canby Auto Wreckers was then presented for the privilege of doing business the coming year and on motion, seconded and carried, approved.

#### ORDINANCE No. 379

Ordinance No. 379 was read for the second time, coming up for final action; placed on final passage and declared adopted. Roll call-Yeas 6-nays 0. This Ordinance regulates parking any and all vehicles upon the streets of Canby, orders suitable warning signs installed and fixes fines for violations.
