## Regular Monthly Meeting April 5, 1954

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council was held on Monday, April 5, 1954, and called to order at 8:05 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Attorney Bettis, City Engineer Tatone, Fire Chief Christiansen, The Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Girod, Hill, Hulbert and Kraft.

2 The minutes of the regular meeting of March 1st were read and approved.

#### Communications

A letter from the Oregon State Board of Health stating that the water samples received have shown the City water to be free of coliform bacteria in every portion examined, and commending the City staff for this accomplishment. A communication from Kenneth H. Spies, Assistant Chief Engineer, State Sanitary

A communication from Kenneth H. Spies, Assistant Chief Engineer, State Sanitary Authority, stating that he would be pleased to attend the public meeting planned for April 7th.

Also, note from James C. Howland stating that he would be present at the same meeting.

Circular letter from N. W. Public Power Association calling attention to the yearly meeting of the association, and stating that our dues were unpaid.

The Mayor then stated that he would like to hear from any visitors present, apparently for the purpose of discussing the sidewalk situation. The Council then listened to Messrs. Earl Oliver, George Payton and G. C. Decker, all of whom spoke in favor of 4 foot sidewalks. Quite a lengthy discussion then ensued but no action taken at this time.

## Reports

The City Treasurer then presented and read his regular report covering the first quarter of 1954, the same being accepted subject to audit by the Finance Committee. A report of police activities for the month presented by J. W. McCormick was read

by the Recorder. The Recorder then read his report for March showing 15 cases in court with fines

aggregating \$125.00 and costs \$27.00.

Fire Chief Christiansen then reported 2 fire calls in the City during the month with no losses. Four rural fire calls with loss of \$515.00 reported on the Joe Atchison fire.

He also reported on ambulance activities consisting of 5 calls during the month and showing the financial report of contributions and expenses with a balance in the banking account of \$1497.89.

City Engineer Tatone then issued his report for the month, a copy of which was handed to each councilman. He recommended an increase for installing meters, also suggested a loading zone charge, and recommended a Planning Commission as something to be desired in the near future. Also announced that he had purchased a used transit for the sum of \$275.00, and which would probably need some adjusting at a cost of about \$25.00. He also suggested a change in the Saturday forenoon work, using 2 men alternately each Saturday.

It was then moved by Beck, Seconded by Girod and carried that a special meeting be held, the date to be set by the Mayor to discuss and decide on the sidewalk matter. The Mayor then set April 13th for this purpose.

It was then moved by Girod, seconded by Beck, and carried, that the matter of landscaping and repairs to the Fire Hall be left to the committee.

Councilman Beck then stated that the American Legion had purchased considerable playground equipment for the City Park and wanted to know where such equipment could be installed. It was then moved by Anderson, seconded by Hill, and carried, that permission be given to install above mentioned equipment subject to direction by the Park Commissioner.

George Irwin then asked for the installation of a new street light on S. Douglas below Sixth near the Matt Hayes new dwelling, and so ordered.

Mayor Eversole then stated that he would set a date of April 20 for a meeting of the Finance Committee, City Engineer Tatone and Mrs. Decker, to meet for the purpose of setting up a tentative budget.

The matter of increases in prices for cemetery operations was then introduced by Councilman Beck. After considerable discussion it was moved by Beck, seconded by Hill, that grave openings be increased \$10.00, price of lots increased by \$20.00; that \$15.00 of the increase of lots and \$5.00 of the increased price for openings be placed in a sinking fund for perpetual care, effective as of May 1, 1954. Other details to be worked out and presented to the June meeting of the Council.

### Ordinances

Ordinances #381 and #382 providing for a special election to be held for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Canby charter amendments were then read for the first time and on motion, seconded and carried, passed on their first reading, ordered posted in 3 public and conspicuous places, and to come up for final action at the recessed meeting of the City Council to be held April 26, 1954. On roll call Yeas - 6, Nays -None.

It then appearing that it would be necessary to have printed and distributed to each voter, a legal pamphlet, prior to election, on motion by Hill, seconded by Anderson and carried, it was so ordered and the expense thereof be allowed.
