

Special Meeting
Tuesday, April 13, 1954

The Council met in special session on Tuesday, April 13 and was called to order at 8.20 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Bettis, City Engineer Tatone, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Hulbert and Kraft.

The Mayor announced that the meeting had been called chiefly for the purpose of discussing sidewalk matters.

Prior to taking up the main business of the evening, the Recorder read communications from A.L. Loucks, President of the League of Oregon Cities, to Mayor Eversole, thanking him for the good attendance from Canby at the recent meeting in West Linn; letter from Kenneth H. Spies, of the State Sanitary Authority, commending the Mayor and Council for the excellent manner in which the sewage disposal issue was presented to the public at the meeting held on April 7.

Mayor Eversole then stated that he would be glad to hear from any visitors present especially relative to the sidewalk controversy, as that was the prime object of the meeting. Messrs. Earl Oliver, George Payton and G.C. Decker spoke in favor of four foot width walks, particularly in the not too close in residential districts.

The recommendations of the committee were then re-read and Atty. Bettis read portions of Ordinance No. 315 relating to sidewalk construction.

Councilman Hulbert suggested that it might be a good idea to appoint a planning commission, composed of council members and citizens to study such matters as walks, parking strips, curbs, etc.

Whereupon, on motion, seconded and carried, it was voted that the Mayor appoint a committee made up of two council members, the City Engineer and two outside citizens for the above mentioned purpose and to report back with recommendations.

Marckx Bakery Matter

In connection with the suit bro't by the above named Company, the following motion was made by Beck, seconded by Anderson and unanimously carried and so ordered:

That Attorney Bettis be instructed to exert his best efforts to negotiate with Marckx Bakery for an agreement resolving the issue, that Marckx Bakery shall first apply for a solicitor's license before canvassing the residents of Canby to buy bread and then shall be entitled to deliver bread and bakery products in filling said orders and without being required to buy a peddler's license as required by Art. 2 of Ordinance 317.

It was then moved by Anderson, seconded by Beck and carried, that steps be taken immediately towards repairs to the new Fire Hall recently damaged.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Kraft and carried, that the sum of \$ 25 be allowed the Volunteer Fire Department as expense money for those members who desire to attend the Civil Defense Convention to be held in Portland shortly.

No other business appearing, the meeting then adjourned.
