

Regular Monthly Meeting  
June 1-1953

The Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, June 1 and was called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, the Recorder, Chief of Police acting Loyd Younce and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Girod, Hill, Hulbert and Kraft.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of May 4 and of the special held on May 14 were read and approved.

The Mayor then announced that inasmuch as numerous visitors were present, he would suspend the regular order of business and invited any or all to speak.

John (electrician) Beck said he was present to seek information as to any action the City might take in installing and serving electric power for irrigation, stating that the P.C.E. would furnish 750' of line free of charge.

Was told that this matter was undecided and it would be necessary to inform him at a later date.

Fire Chief Yoder then asked that Mr. R.M. Williams, salesman for the Wilco Fire Equipment Co. be allowed to demonstrate a new resuscitator to be used in ambulance service. Mr. Williams explained the workings of the machine (Stenenson), price being \$ 260 plus \$ 16.50 with oxygen tank. No action.

It then appearing that quite a few of the visitors present were there on behalf of Supt. Raines, who had been previously notified by the Council that his services would not be required after July first, Harold Ott first spoke for himself and other city employees, by stating that there had always been perfect harmony between Raines and the men and gave much credit to him as a fine boss to get along with.

Several persons asked for the reasons for relieving Mr. Raines of his duties; the Mayor answering that the Council and Raines did not seem to get along and it was thought it was for the best interest of the City to make a change.

Councilmen Hulbert and Girod stated that the City needed a qualified engineer, one who could direct all phases of city work.

Raines then spoke at some length, mostly relative to more or less friction in the office, particularly criticising Mrs. Decker for many things that had occurred in the last few years.

Mrs. Decker, being on the defensive, denied most of the allegations made by Raines and intimated, that in her opinion, he had not been quite fair.

#### Communications

From S.I.A.C. relative to extension of time on purchase of new trailer as requested by inspector.

From S.P. Co. as to cost of light at crossing on Elm st.

#### Reports of Officers

Report of L.D. Younce, Acting Police Chief, was read by Councilman Kraft.

Recorder reported no cases in his Court during month.

Fire Chief reported one call-no damage, out on arrival.

Councilmen Kraft reported that arrangements had been made to meet with the R.F.D. committee on Thursday evening, June 4.

Councilman Girod then moved that the Council go on record as favoring the clay tile in the construction of the new fire-hall and instruct our committee to use their influence in that respect. The motion was seconded by Hill and carried.

It was then moved by Girod, seconded by Kraft and carried that the Recorder be instructed to notify the Wilkinson Mill Co. that unless satisfactory arrangements be made on or before June 10, with respect to their indebtedness to the City for electric power and water, services will be discontinued.

Councilman Girod then said he wished to congratulate Supt. Raines for good work in connection with the installation of flood lights for Wait Park and also thought a congratulatory letter should be forwarded to the Lions' Club after contract was signed.

The Recorder was then asked to contact Thomas & Telford as to the liability insurance coverage with respect to Wait Park activities.

It was then moved by Anderson, seconded by Kraft and carried, that the City Attorney prepare a 10 year franchise, granting the Canby Telephone Association the right to operate within the limits of Canby.

It was then moved by Hill, seconded by Hulbert and carried, that Ronald (G) Tatone be appointed as Supt. of Public Works for one year at a salary of \$ 400 per month, as of July 1-1953.
