Regular Monthly Meeting Monda, July 6-1953

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council was held on Monday, July 6, 1953 and called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Tatone, the Recorder, Fire Chief Yoder (late) and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Girod, Hill, (late), Hulbert and Kraft. The minutes of the previous regular meeting of June 1 and those of the special sessions of June 3,15 and July 2 were read and approved.

The regular order of business was then suspended in order to listen to visitors. Mr. Harry Snell then addressed the Council, presenting a type of insurance for employees, whereby premiums would be deducted from wages each month.

EX-Supt Raines then asked for a " clean bill of health" in connection with inventories taken as on Jan. 1-1952, both by himself and employees and again by Curtis Johnson. He was told that the committee appointed to check both inventories reported only slight differences between the two and no criticisms appeared.

The matter of the alleged salary due Raines in connection with his accident on October 24-1947, as set up by the S.I.A.C. was then bro't up and on motion, second and carried, the City Attorney was asked to make an investigation, with the aid of a good insurance attorney and report back the result.

Communications

Letter from Thomas & Telford and enclosing copy of one from the Oregon Automobile Ins. Co. stating that the City is well protected in connection with activities at Wait Park, under it's public liability policy.

From Atty. Dale Jacobs approving the Christian bond furnished in connection with the construction of the new Fire Department building.

Letter from the Lions Club stating that it was the intention of the Club that a certain bleacher seat in Wait Park installed by them, become the property of the City.

A petition for the paving of North Ivy street from 6th street to Virginia Avenue and signed by 24 property owners in the district was then presented and on motion, seconded and carried the City Attorney was instructed to prepare an ordinance covering the same.

Reports

City Treasurer Johnson presented and read his regular quarterly report, which was accepted, subject to audit by the finance committee.

Fire Chief Yoder reported two calls in the City during the month, with no loss and one in the R.F.D., being the Lucas fire, estimated loss § 8000. The Recorder then read the monthly report of the police department, showing

traffic violations, warning tickets given, investigations made, etc.

Whereupon the Clayton Christian bond, signed by Mm. E. Herman and Eva W. Herman and given in connection with the construction of the new fire hall, was presented • the same having been approved by the Rural Fire District officials, on motion by Anderson, seconded by Beck and carried, the Council declared its approval and the Mayor and Recorder instructed to affix their signatures. On roll call-Yeas 6-nays 0.

By motion, seconded and carried, it was then voted to accept the deed from the Rural Fire District, conveying an undivided one-half interest in and to the ground on which the fire hall is to be built, payment for which to be the sum of \$ 1145.00, payable two years from date of contract-January 15-1953.

It was then moved by Beck, seconded by Hill and carried, that the Mayor appoint a committee to meet with the Canby Telephone directors on Wednesday, July 8, for the purpose of discussing proposed franchise renewal. Committee-Beck, Anderson and Kraft.

Ordinances.

Ordinance No. 372 levying a tax on all taxable property both real and personal within the corporate limits of Canby in the sum of \$ 6878.00 for the fiscal year July 1-1953-July 1-1954 was then introduced, passed on first reading, ordered posted in the prescribed legal manner and to come up for final action at the regular meeting of the Council to be held on July 20-1953. Yeas 6-nays 0.

Ordinance No. 373 providing for a paying job on North Ivy street between 6th. street and Virginia Avenue, in pursuance of a petition filed with the City Council signed by property owners, was then introduced, passed on first reading, ordered published in the prescribed legal manner and to come up for final action at a regular meeting of the Council to be held on July 29-1953 at 8 P.M. in the City Hall of Canby. Roll Call-Yeas 6-Nays 0.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that regular meetings of the Council be held on Monday, July 13 and on Monday, July 20, 1953 in the City Hall, Canby at 8 o'clock P.M.
