

Regular Monthly Meeting
Tuesday, Sept. 8-1953

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Tuesday, Sept. 8, the previous Monday being a holiday. Called to order at 8.10 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, City Engineer Tatone, the Recorder, Fire Chief Yoder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Girod, Hill, Hulbert and Kraft.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of August 3, read and approved.

The regular order of business was then suspended and Lindsay Wilson from the office of Piepenbrink & Kron submitted and read his audit report of the City's books as of July 1-1953.

Mr. Hayes of the engineering firm of Cornell, Howland, Hays and Merryfield, having been asked to meet with the Council, then addressed the meeting relative as to advantages there might be in having an expert survey of our electric power system.

Questions were asked and answered by Mr. Hayes, but no action was taken.

Communications

From the Canby Telephone Association, approving and accepting the terms set out in Ordinance No. 374 relating to the franchise recently granted.

From the State Highway Department stating that a warrant for \$ 4825.82 would soon be mailed, representing Canby's allotment for the second half of 1953 from State Tax Street funds. (warrant rec'd later) .

From the S.P.Co., Supt. L.P.Hopkins, relative to using R.R. property for parking purposes, asking what the City feels it can pay for the privilege.

It was then moved by Girod, seconded by Kraft and carried, that the sum of \$ 3750 be transferred to the Fire Hall building fund from the Sewer Sinking Fund, the same to be replaced out of special tax money when available, plus interest at the same rate as Sewer Fund now drawing. Roll call, Yeas 6-nays 0 .

Reports of Officers

Fire Chief Yoder reported two city calls during the month, no damage resulting. Rural District-three calls, field fires, small damages. On August 30 called out account fire which destroyed S.P.Co. and Crown-Zellerbach bridges, with heavy losses to both.

Police Dept. by Joe McCormick reported activities for month, usual routine, gas consumption 364.3 gals-mileage 2722 miles.

Recorder reported 17 cases in Court, resulting in fines of \$ 170.00, costs \$ 39.50 net \$ 130.50 .

Yoder also suggested having hydrant installed in closer proximity to the city garbage dump. no action.

It was then moved by Girod, seconded by Beck and carried, that The Volunteer Fire Department be allotted the sum of \$ 50.00 per month instead of \$ 40.00, the increase to take effect as of July 1-1953.

City Engineer Tatone then advised the purchase of more traffic signs for installation at logical places within the city limits; also one transformer.

On motion by Hill, seconded by Hulbert and carried, Tatone was authorized to purchase the above.

It was then moved by Girod, seconded by Kraft and carried that all city employees handling funds be bonded in the sum of \$ 1000 each.

Whereupon on motion by Hulbert, seconded by Kraft and carried, it was voted that paid holidays (New Years, Memorial Day, July 4, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas) be allowed regular employees, who have served 6 months or more and working on an hourly basis.

Council Girod then suggested that some policy should be adopted as to the purchase of gasoline and other supplies from city business houses and that a committee be appointed to act in the matter. The other members of the council appearing to be favorable to the suggestion, Mayor Eversole named the following to serve-Anderson, Beck and Kraft.

Mayor Eversole then stated that it was about time something was done in the matter of the proposed installation of sewers in the city and at this time he would appoint, with approval of the Council a committee of two from the council and three citizens; as follows:

Council- Hill and Hulbert ----- Citizens-Monahan, Ernie Meeks and Chas. McKenzie.

The Recorder was then requested to write the S.P. Co. offering \$ 100 a year for rent of space for public parking, as mentioned above in letter from Supt. Hopkins.

The following bills and claims were then presented and on motion, seconded and carried, ordered paid and warrants drawn: Roll call Yeas 6-nays 0 .
