Postponed Meeting esday, Oct. 13-1953

A meeting of the Council was called to order at 8.15 P.M/ on Tuesday, Octo. 13, having been postponed from Monday, October 5, at which time it was impossible to obtain a quorum.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, City Engineer Tatone, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Girod, Hulbert and Kraft.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of September 8 were read and approved.

Communications

Letter from Governor Paul L. Patterson relative to the creation of an Oregon Developement Commission for the purpose of broadening the economic base of the State and devoloping increased and more stable payrolls.

Also letter from the Governor extending an invitation to attend the Governor's Industrial Safety Conference meeting to be held November 19-20 in the Masonic Temple, Portland.

Communication from the S.P. Company relative to the installation of "stop" signs at Elm st. and stating that the Company would place the signs, providing the City would pass an ordinance with a penal/ty if not obeyed.

From Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merryfield, by Mr. Roderick, relative to the proposed sewer system and recommending that figures submitted to the City on Sept. 4, 1951 be used and a General Bond Issue of \$ 150,000.00 be set.

Reports

The City Treasurer's report covering the quarter ending Sept. 30 was presented and read by the Recorder and accepted subject to audit by the finance committee.

A report of the police department was submitted by officer McCormick, showing no unusual activities.

The Recorder reported 14 cases in Court during the month, resulting in fines of \$ 157.50 - Costs \$ 37.00-net \$ 120.50.

Fire Chief Yoder reported three city calls and one RFD call in September with no damages. Chief Yoder also stated that it seemed advisable to purchase a new siren, radio equipment for the new salvage truck, two walky-talkies and a moving picture projector; all of which would be bo't under the "Matching funds" program of the Federal and State governments.

It was then moved by Girod, seconded by Anderson, that Yoder be authorized to make the above purchases, with the O.K. of the Rural Fire Protection District.

Councilman Kraft then reported that the Fire Hall was nearing completion and that a number of changes and additions to the original plan had been made, the extra cost to date, being \$ 1940.39 bringing the total contract to \$ 25490.39.

It was then moved by Girod, seconded by Kraft and carried, that the sum of \$ 5000 be transferred from the Sewer Sinking Fund account to the Canby-RFD Bldg. Account.

Councilman Girod the moved, being seconded by Hulbert and carried, that the Building Committee, with the approval of the Rural Fire District officials, at once have adequate fire insurance placed on the new building.

Mayor Eversole then stated that, to help solve the drainage problem on First street, it would be a good idea to remove the two trees opposite the Masonic Building, after first explaining to the Civic Club, the reason thereof.

In this connection, City Engineer Tatone was asked to take measurements to find out if they were on City property or S.P. right of way.

It was then moved by Hulbert, seconded by Kraft and carried that the trees be removed.

Council Girod then bro't up the matter of the condition of the Cemetery, stating, that there was considerable need of improvement and thought the caretaker should be so notified. Commissioner Beck agreed.

Mr. John P. Tatone, living just outside the City limits of N.W. Canby and now being served by the City electric system, asked for another line, giving him a three phase service. After lengthy discussion, it was moved by Hulbert, seconded by Kraft and carried, it was voted that the same be allowed with the understanding it would be decided later whether or not he would be charged with cost of installation.
