RESOLUTION of intention to **l**ease from the Southern P_acific R_ailway Company, a parking strip for automobiles, to pay the rental therefor, and to improve said parking strip for the convenience of parking automobiles.

THE CITY OF CANBY DOES RESOLVE:

Section 1- The City Council of the City of Canby,Oregon, deems it necessary and expedient, and required for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Canby, and adjacent vicinities, and hereby declares its intention to enter into alease from the Southern Pacific Railway Company, for the rental of that certain property of the Southern Pacific Company, bounded by First Street, and the railroad tracks of said Southern Pacific Company.

Section 2- That said parking strip shall consist tentatively of the following; The eastward parking strip to begin about 200 feet west of Ivy Street, and end 200 feet east of Grant Street, to provide a 325-foot parking strip. The westward strip would begin 200 feet west of Grant Street and continue to a point 200 feet east of Elm Street. That the rental value of such parking strip is \$100.00 per annum.

Section 3- That it is necessary for the City of Canby to enter into a lease with the Said Southern Pacific Company, for the leasing of said above described parking strip, and that the Mayor and City Recorder of the City of Canby are hereby authorized and directed to enter into such lease with the Southern Pacific Company for a term of one year, and to renew such lease from year to year as the necessity and convenience there-of may require. of may require.

Section 4- That the City of Canby through its City Engineer shal, improve said parking strips for the convenience of motor vehicle owners desiring to use said parking strip.

Section 5- WHEREAS, it is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the City of Canby that this resolution take effect immediately, an emergency hereby is declared to exist and this resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its approval by the Mayor.
