

Regular Meeting-City Council
Monday, Dec. 7-1953

The Council met in regular session on Monday, December 7, 1953 and was called to order at 8.10 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, City Engineer Tatone, Fire Chief Yoder, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Girod, Hill, Hulbert and Kraft.

The minutes of the previous meetings of November 2 and 12 were read and approved.

The regular order of business was then suspended to listen to the proposition of W. Hinrichs to paint the water tank and tower.

In this connection it was later moved by Hill, seconded by Anderson and carried, that Hinrich's bid of \$ 750.00 including labor and material be accepted and a contract be drawn covering details.

Communications.

Letter from the Clackamas County Civil Defense Agency extending congratulations on the construction of the new Fire Hall and expressing appreciation for the cooperation shown by Fire Chief Yoder and all members of the fire department.

Letter from the Canby Chamber of Commerce asking the Council to express its views in connection with the construction of a new bridge over the Molalla River at the old Knight's Bridge site.

Whereupon on motion by Hulbert, seconded by Hill and carried, the following Resolution was adopted and a copy ordered forwarded to the County Court:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The historic bridge, known as Knight's Bridge, which crossed the Molalla River at Canby, was destroyed by the elements some ten years ago, and

WHEREAS, Loss of the bridge necessitates a long detour over a crowded state highway, for traffic between Canby and agricultural area in the near vicinity, and has caused an ever-increasing hazard for school busses, which must cross Southern Pacific main line railroad tracks four times daily, and

WHEREAS, A new bridge at the site of the old one, and with an adequate road to the new Red Bridge to be built over the Pudding River, will provide direct access from Canby to the new Portland -Salem expressway, and

WHEREAS, The Honorable County Court of Clackamas County has in many years past postponed consideration of a new Knight's Bridge because of lack of funds, and

WHEREAS, The City of Canby has practically doubled in population and adjacent area increased proportionately since the bridge was lost, thereby intensifying its need, Now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the City Council of the City of Canby respectfully urges the Honorable County Court of Clackamas County to appropriate the necessary funds and proceed with all possible dispatch toward construction of this bridge and the inter-connecting roads.

Reports of Officers

Detailed report of the police department signed by J.W.McCormick was submitted and read by the Recorder . Report showed mileage on police car (2158) consumption of gas (327 gals) arrests, warning tickets issued and various other activities.

The Recorder reported 8 cases in court during the month, resulting in fines of \$ 95.00, costs \$ 21.50.

Officer Fieger reported having attended school for peace officers held at Salem and deriving much benefit therefrom.

City Engineer Tatone submitted a monthly report covering the various departments, a copy of which was handed to each councilman and one for the files.

Report of Committees

Councilman Kraft reported on the completion of the Fire Hall and of the " Opening House" event, which was well attended. Everything seemed to be satisfactory, with no criticisms.

Councilman Hill stated that Mr. Herman was now asking for the release of his bond and for a letter stating that all liens have been paid.

In this connection it was also understood that the Fire Hall committee would ask for the sanction of the Herman bond release, by the Rural Fire District.

Councilman Hill for the Sewer Committee reported having a meeting at which Mr. Curtiss M. Everts, state sanitary engineer was present and that considerable excellent advice had been received from him.

Chairman Hill stated that the next procedure should be to decide on a plan of financing and the securing of easements through private properties where sewer lines would be laid; whereupon City Atty. Zimmerman and Mr. Tatone were asked to prepare a list of property owners from whom it would be necessary to secure easements.

City Engineer Tatone then reported that Neal Thompson was asking for city electric power for his buildings, the lines to be on his own property and cost of installation and maintenance to be assumed by him.

Whereupon on motion by Anderson, seconded by Hill and carried, the request was granted and Tatone instructed to advise him by letter.

The following matters were then presented and disposed of as follows:

It was decided that 6% interest from December 1st. 1953 should be charged on street improvement liens unpaid.

A health and accident plan for employees was discussed at some length and left for further investigation.

Messrs. Hill, Hulbert and Tatone were appointed to ponder the parking problem and to come up with recommendations. The City attorney was also asked to prepare and ordinance relative to same.

It was moved, seconded and carried that the state license of the Hi-Way Market for sale of package beer be approved.

It was also moved, seconded and carried that the Mayor and Recorder be instructed to sign the S.P. termination lease of the bell tower, which had been recently removed.
