

The Council met on Thursday, December 10 and was called to order at 8.15 P.M.
Present: Mayor Eversole, City Engineer Tatone, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Girod, Hill, Hulbert and Kraft.

The Mayor announced this as being a continuation of the meeting of Dec. 7 in order to complete unfinished business, including the introduction of an ordinance relating to parking on the streets of Canby.

Ordinance No. 379

The above ordinance states that, by virtue and the authority of the police power vested in it, ^{THE CITY COUNCIL} will after its passage regulate the parking of any and all motor vehicles, erect suitable warning signs and fixing fines for violations thereof.

Whereupon, on motion by Hulbert, seconded by Anderson and carried was declared passed on its first reading and to come up for final action on Monday, Jan. 4-1954.
Roll call-Yeas 5-nays 0.

The parking committee then recommended the following rules: to be in effect from 8 o'clock A.M. to 6 o'clock daily except Sundays;

Parallel parking on both sides of First St. from Ivy to Elm.
Prohibited on west side of Grant between First and R.R. tracks.
Ditto for about 16 feet from Grant on south side of First.
Half hour parking on North side of First-Elm to Ivy.
One hour on South side of First -Elm to Ivy. 10' ~~feet~~ zone for Postoffice.
One hour on both sides of Grant -First to Second.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that the contract with W. Hinrichs covering the painting of the water tank be signed by the Mayor and that the paint be ordered through the Canby Hdw. & Impl. Co. and the sum of \$ 250.00 for same be assumed by the contractor.

It was then moved by Kraft, seconded by Anderson and carried, that the bond given by Wm. Herman and wife in connection with the construction of the new Fire-Hall be released, after meeting the approval of the Rural Fire District officials.

It was then found necessary to transfer \$ 500 more from the Sewer Sinking Fund to the Fire Hall building account and so ordered previously.

On motion, seconded and carried, the meeting then adjourned.
