

Regular Monthly Meeting
Monday, Jan. 5, 1953

The City Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, January 5 and was called to order at 8 o'clock P.M. by Mayor Eversole.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, Chief of Police McClurg, Fire Chief Yoder, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Girod, Hill, Hulbert and Kraft.

The Recorder announced that the new members had previously taken the oath of office.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of December 1 were then read and approved.

The Mayor then stated that the rules would be suspended and any visitors present would be heard.

Whereupon Mr. R.P. Sticka asked the Council as to the possibility of being supplied electric power for himself and neighbors, although located beyond the city limits. Councilman Girod suggested that it might be advisable to take up this matter later by the new council and stated that a petition would be given consideration.

Mr. Henry Waespe then asked for city water service installation for himself and others on the Ferry Road and deposited his check for \$ 550 with the City to cover the approximate cost of his own connection, in accordance with estimate furnished by Supt. Raines, it was understood that prior to commencing the work, others desiring service would each advance his costs as advised by Mr. Raines.

Reports of Officers

City Treasurer Johnson presented and read his report covering receipts and disbursements for the various funds and for the quarter ending December 31.

Chief of Police McClurg reported police activities for December, showing arrests made, warnings given, mileage covered by car (1730) gas consumed (272) and other details.

Fire Chief Yoder reported one city call in December-loss \$ 136.00 and one rural district call with loss of \$ 100.00.

He also reported for the year ending Dec. 31, 1952 there were 19 calls in the City limits, resulting in losses of \$ 2336.00 on a \$ 17400 valuation. Rural District calls 37 with loss of \$ 46250.00 on valuation of \$ 121800.00; the greater part of the rural losses resulting from the shingle mill and the Christian and Missionary Alliance Camp Grounds fires.

The Recorder reported 13 cases in Court during the past month, resulting in fines aggregating \$ 217.50-costs \$ 45.00.

Clarence Eid then reported having taken inventory as of January 1 of supplies and equipment, with the exception of poles in yard, which were not segregated as to lengths.

In this connection, Councilman Girod stated that in his opinion, poles should be stacked so that actual measurement could be taken. Supt. Raines said this could not be done until new rack was built and asked that members visit the yard and view the situation.

Fire Chief Yoder then called to the attention of the Council, the firemen's convention to be held shortly at Salem and asked if any expense allowance would be granted for those who planned to attend.

Whereupon, it was moved by Kraft, seconded by Girod, that the sum of \$ 50.00 be granted for that purpose. Carried and so ordered.

It was then suggested that a letter of appreciation be forwarded to the Volunteer Fire Dept. members, for their time, energy and labor in planting and decorating the tree at Christmas time and the Recorder was asked to formulate such.

Councilman Kraft then announced that he had arranged for a meeting with the Rural Fire directors for Thursday, January 8, to discuss new building plans.

Ordinances

Ordinance No. 371, being an Act to amend to amend Rule 6 of Ordinance No. 313, adopting Rules and Regulations governing connections to the City of Canby Water Works System, then came up for final action and on motion, seconded and carried, declared adopted. On roll call- Yeas 6-Nays 0.

Mayor Eversole then stated that he would like to present a list of various matters, which, in his opinion should be given consideration during the next two years of his administration.

Whereupon, on motion by Girod, seconded by Anderson and carried, Councilman Kraft was unanimously elected President of the Council.

Mayor Eversole then stated that he would appoint a special committee to investigate and see what could be done towards eliminating the liability of accidents on the R.R. crossings in the City.

The following were named- Beck, Hulbert and Hill.

The Mayor also stated that the following committee on salaries and wages would be continued: Anderson, Hill and Girod.

It was then bro't to the attention of the Council, that Mrs. Cattley, Librarian for the City Library Association would like to receive her monthly check from the City, instead of from the Library Board, thereby coming under Social Security. It appearing that the amount involved was so small, it was not thought best to make this change.

Councilman Kraft then stated that it would be necessary to purchase some uniform clothing for the police reserves, also another gun for the department, which matters were left to Messrs. Kraft and Hill.
