Regular Monthly Meeting .day, Febr. 2-1953

The regular monthly session of the Council was held on Monday, Febr. 2 and called to order at 8.05 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, the Recorder, Chief of Police Mc. Clurg, Fire Chief Yoder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Girod, Hill, Hulbert and Kraft. The minutes of the previous regular meeting of Jan. 5 were read and approved.

Communications

From the street superintendent of Eugene, recommending Mr. Ray Stetler to any having need of his services and presented by Mr. Stetler in person.

From the City of Gold Hill, Oregon, enclosing a copy of a resolution adopted by its council and urging its passage by all Oregon cities; the gist of the resolution being to support a bill about to be introduced in the Legislature relative to accident prevention at railroad crossings.

From the State Highway Dept. acknowledging our letter regarding a pedestrian crossing on 99E at Elm Street and stating that it had been turned over to the Engineer for consideration.

From the Oregon Civil Defense Agency relative to fire hopse-when deliveries will begin and cost of same.

From the Volunteer Fire Dept. announcing approval and recommending appointment of Clayton Yoder for Fire Chief.

From the Canby Garden Club suggesting various improvements for Wait park and recommending installation of tables, benches, a wading pool for the kids and also the planting of trees and making it available for picnic parties.

Also a letter from Mrs. Harold Bigham, along the same lines.

Reports

City Treasurer presented his annual report, being a consolidation of the quarterly reports for 1952, the same being accepted subject to the audit of the finance committee.

Police Chief McClurg made his usual report of activities, covering number of arreste made, investigations and miscellaneous matters. Total mileage covered 1838-gas consumed 269-4 gals. Total cost of gas, oil and repairs \$ 116.73. The Recorder reported 25 cases in Court-fines \$ 221.00-costs \$ 51.00

Councilman Kraft reported a meeting with the Rural Fire Didtrict directors and stated that another one would be held shortly; The architects having been chosen and the firemen having indicated various features desired in the plan for the new building.

Councilmen Girod then bro't up the idea of having the men employed in the electric power department registered as apprentices, as at present they were accumulating no credit to be able to become licensed linemen later. Left to the Mayor, Girod and Raines to investigate necessary steps.

Mayor Eversole then stated that he was in favor of the immediate purchase of more street lighting, especially in the school areas and certain other locations. In connection with this, it was moved by Girod, seconded by Beck and carried,

that 15 Mercury Vapor be ordered.

Councilman Girod then stated that it would be a good idea to have streets and house numbers inserted in the telephone directory to be published soon, by the Canby Herald ; streets and numbers of each customer to be supplied by the City Water & Light office. So ordered.

It then having been bro't to the attention of the Council that some encroachment had been made by certan parties on the old section of highway from Birch to 99E, now dedicated back to the City and the true width of which is not known, the Recorder was asked to contact the City Engineer, Ralph Milln and request him to establish the proper lines.

Councilman Beck then reported that various repairs on buildings at the Cemetery were needed and was asked to secure estimates of probably cost thereof and report back. Beck also stated that a So. Pacific representative would be in Canby on February 16 to discuss with the Council the matter of R.R. crossing accidents.

February 2-continued.

The Recorder was instructed to write Senator Howard Belton, asking him to notify the Canby city government, if at any time matters came up in the Legislature of any interest or that would affect the City in one way or another.

It was then moved by Kraft, seconded by Girod and carried, that Clayton Yoder be re-appointed Fire Chief for the current year-1953.

In connection with above, the Recorder was asked to advise the Volunteer Fire Department of Yoder's appointment and ask that in the future, its recommendation for a candidate for this office be made in time for the Council to act at the first meeting in the year.

Fire Chief Yoder then called to the attention of the Council the advisability of having an uptodate map of the City, showing water mains, etc.

It then appearing that Mrs. Decker and Mrs. Clay had applied for increase in salaries, after some discussion, it was left to the Wage & Salaries committee to recommend.
