

Regular Monthly Meeting
Mor , March 2-1953

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday, March 2 and called to order at 8.20 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, the Recorder, Chief of Police McClurg, Fire Chief Yoder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Girod, Hill, Hulbert and Kraft.

The minutes of the regular meeting of Febr. 2 and those of the special meeting of Febr. 4 were read and approved.

The regular order of business was then suspended to listen to any outsiders who might wish to present any matters.

Whereupon a representative of the Marckx Bakery of Gresham stated that he wished to operate a bread wagon in the city limits, but claiming that after establishing a route, he would not sell products from his truck, objected to the fees as set up in the ordinance covering the matter.

In this connection, the Recorder was instructed to advise the Bakery that any license could only be issued under the terms of the ordinance.

Communications

From the State Highway Department relative to the act which provides that cities under 5000 may apply for improvement on certain streets which are receiving excessive wear or heavy and unusual industrial traffic.

From Senator Howard Belton, stating that he has placed the City on his mailing list for anything that might be of special interest.

From the State Board of Health, stating that the water samples from the City the past year have been very satisfactory and commending the Mayor and his staff for the careful operation of the water system.

From the League of Oregon Cities relative to the problem of engineering service for small cities.

From Raymond Johnson, Secretary of the Canby Farm Bureau, stating that the Bureau had gone on record as opposing any movement to have daylight saving time in Oregon.

Reports

Police Chief McClurg submitted his regular monthly report of activities, including arrests made, investigations and other miscellaneous matters.

The Recorder reported 28 cases in Court during the month, resulting in fines of \$ 267.00 assessed and collected-costs \$ 59.00. Also two building permits issued.

Fire Chief Yoder reported only one city call in month. No rural calls.

Supt. Raines reported on completion of 6 dry wells and recommended the purchase of at least 15 additional Mercury Vapor street lights and half a dozen transformers. He also reported that Ralph Milln had surveyed that portion of the old highway running past the Stefani mill operations and found that they had encroached 14 feet on city property.

Raines then bro't up the matter of qualifying the electric power employees as apprentices in order that they might be accumulating credit, if they wished to become journeymen. It appearing that various requirements entered into this matter, it was left until more information could be secured from the State Labor Commissioner's office.

Councilman Beck reported having an interview with representative from the S.P. and was told that signal light could be installed at the Elm street crossing providing the City would assume one half the cost. Also stated that a hearing before the P.U.C. would probably result in slowing down the trains. *

It was then reported that the Park lighting project had been approved by Bonneville, providing a profit of 9% on the investment could be shown and some organization be responsible for monthly payments for power.

Councilman Girod for the Committee on salaries and wages announced not prepared to make recommendations at this time.

It then appearing that Mr. C.E. Stewart, District Engineer had requested some information as to the proposed sewer project, the Recorder was asked to write him, suggesting a personal interview with Mayor Eversole.

It was then moved, seconded and carried, that 15 more Mercury Vapor street lights be ordered for June delivery.

* Meaning that the only way to get the trains to slow down in the City limits would be by order issued by the P.U.C.
