

Special Meeting-Monday, April 20-1953

A special meeting of the Council was held on Monday, April 20 and called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor Eversole, Supt. Raines, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Beck, Girod, Hill, Hulbert and Kraft.

The Mayor announced that the meeting had been called for the purpose of considering applications for positions on the police force, and any other matters that might be presented.

The Recorder then read applications from the following:

Mr. Simmons, serving as night patrolman temporarily, appeared before the Council and was questioned concerning his previous condition of servitude, etc. and apparently made a favorable impression.

However, no other appointments were made, pending further investigations.

Supt. Raines then asked the Council for the privilege of using old poles for fence posts, firewood, etc. Whereupon on motion by Beck, seconded by Hill and carried it was voted that if he would clear up the pole yard, he be allowed to use the discards, paying the City the sum of \$ 1.00 for same.

Mayor Eversole then asked the Recorder to read a letter he had had framed, addressed to the S.P.Co., relative to the possibility of using part of the R.R. property, bordering First Avenue, for parking purposes.

He stated that he was doing this at the instigation of some of the merchants along the street and asked the approval of the Council, which was given.

Councilman then presented blueprints of the new proposed fire-hall building and stated that he had made arrangements for a meeting with the rural district directors and architects for Wednesday evening, April 22.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
