Special Meeting-Api 29-1953

The Council met in special session on Monday, April 29, with the following present: Mayor Eversole and Councilmen Anderson, Hill, Hulbert and Kraft.

Curtis Johnson, Jr. kept the minutes in the absence of the Recorder.

Applications for a position in the police department were considered and some applicants were interviewed in person. No action.

It then appeared that a representative of the State Labor Commission was present relative to the State program for apprentices, which he described in part as follows:

For this district there is an apprenticeship committee appointed in Oregon City, which sets up a program to be followed in accordance with an agreement between employer and employee.

Application would then be made for privilege of attending school of instruction, which requires attendance of a minimum of 1/44 hours a year-three year course for linemen. On completion of course, the State issues certificate.

Matter of installing light system for Wait Park.

Ed. Johnson stated that the Lions Club was prepared to proceed with its program in the above matter, providing the City will permit use of untreated cedar poles and will provide transformer.

Mr. Nordstrom of the General Electric Supply Co. then explained how lights would be installed.

It was then moved by Kraft, seconded by Anderson and carried that butt treated poles be used.

No other business appearing the meeting adjourned.
