## Reports of Officers

The City Treasurer's report for the quarter ending June 30 was read and accepted subject to audit by the Finance Committee.

Report of the Chief of Police covering his activities for June was submitted and read.

Fire Chief Yoder reported m city calls but 6 rural district calls, the principal one being the shingle mill at New Era- loss estimated at \$ 31500.

The Recorder reported four cases in his Court resulting in fines of \$ 62.50-costs \$ 12.50. Three dismissed with warnings.

Supt. Raines reported that the R.H.Hale residence just outside the city limits in N.W. Canby would soon be supplied electric power by Canby.

Raines also asked that arrangements be made for at least one of the bookkeepers to report at the office at 8 o'clock A.M., to care for early morning customers. This matter was left to the Recorder to adjust.

#### Ordinance

Ordinance No. 366 then came up for final action and on motion by Girod, seconded by Anderson, and carried, declared adopted. Yeas 5-nays O.

This ordinance provides for the oiling of south 6th. avenue and some adjacent streets in part, over a three year period, the cost to be assessed against properties benefited.

### Miscellaneous matters.

The Council did not see fit to grant the permit to Mrs. Plummer for a dwelling to be erected on N.W. 4th. Avenue opposite the Mary Atkins property.

No action was taken in regard to the \$ 15000 proposed bond issue, except to favor individual borrowing , if possible.

Relative to the request of Earl Oliver for a quitclaim from the City of the piece of ground previously mentioned above, the City Attorney was asked to prepare an ordinance, necessary in this case.

It was then moved by Girod, seconded by Anderson and carried, that the Mayor and Recorder be instructed and authorized to sign the prepared contract with the City of Barlow, whereby Barlow is to be furnished all reasonable fire protection by the Canby Volunteer Fire Department for the sum of \$ 50.00 per year, dating from June 30-1952, said payments to be turned over to the Fire Department for its services.

It then appearing that the City has need of a new power lawn mower for use in Wait park, it was left to Councilman Rupp to use his best judgment in the matter.

Councilman Kraft was also authorized to have a two way radio installed in the police car, said radio to be on the same frequency as the sheriff's office and Oregon City fire department.

No other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
