Rer lar Monthly Meeting M. Lay, August 4-1952

The Council met in regular session on Monday, August 4 and was called to order at 9.25 P.M. D.S.T.

Present on roll call were -Mayor Irwin, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, Chief of Police Rivers, the Recorder and Councilmen Cutsforth, Girod, Hill and Rupp, Councilman Kraft reporting later.

The minutes of the previous monthly meeting of July 7 were read and approved. Prior to the opening of the meeting, Mr. Thos. E. Black, District Manager for Bonneville, being present explained to the members the change in the E-4 rate schedule, showing that it would result favorably for Canby.

After the opening of the session, Mr. Ward, also from Bonneville, addressed the members along the same lines and also gave out some information as to rates for irrigation, which had been requested by Supt. Raines.

Whereupon, in connection with the above, on motion of Hill, seconded by Girod and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to sign and return copies of letters, which had been prepared by the B.P.A. and showing the acceptance of the amended rate schedule.

It being necessary to return a Resolution with the above, covering this matter, this also was included in the motion and the following was later prepared by the Recorder:

### RESOLUTION

" RESOLVED, THAT the Bonneville Wholesale Power Rate, Schedule E-4 as amended July 1-1952 be substituted for the schedule included in our power contract with the Bonneville Power Administration and that the Mayor and Recorder be hereby authorized to execute and sign the same, affixing the seal of the City of Canby."

### Communications

From the Oregon State Civil Defense Agency relative to purchase of fire equipment, whereby part payment is to be contributed from Federal and State funds.

Letter from E.J.Noble, attorney in connection with the application of Mrs. Hazel Palmer for permit to build on 4th. Avenue.

From Tom Gerber relative to a meeting to be held in the County Court room on August 12 for the formulation of plans for "outlining a long-range plan of development in the metropolitan areas outside your city limits."

This is in connection with a letter received by Mr. Gerber from the members of the County Court and which he thought should be bro't before the Council for consideration.

Mayor Irwin stated that he would attend the meeting and would like company.

Ordinance No. 367 forbids the construction of sidewalks on Ferry Road, a continuation of Holly street in a northerly direction.

Ordinance No. 368 making S.W. 4th. Avenue from "Fir Place" to Elm street a 40 foot street.

Ordinance No. 369 making N.W. 6th. Avenue from Grant St. to the Jack Meek property a 40 foot street.

It was then moved by Girod, seconded by Kraft and carried, that Councilmen Hill and Rupp confer together how to proportion between the water and cemetery funds, the cost of the water extension service to the cemetery, the job having been recently completed.
