

Regular Monthly Meeting
Tues , Sept. 2-1952

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Tuesday, Sept. 2, the first Monday being a holiday.

The meeting was called to order at 9 o'clock P.M. D.S.T. with the following present: Mayor Irwin, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, the Recorder and councilman Anderson, Girod, Hill and Kraft. Absent- Cutsforth and Rupp.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of August 4 were read and approved.

Mayor Irwin then announced that the report of the auditor would be heard before taking up the regular order of business.

Whereupon Auditor Lindsay Wilson from the office of Piepenbrook and Kron, public accountants read his report of the examination of the books covering the fiscal year ending June 30, 1952.

On motion by Girod, seconded by Kraft and carried, the report was accepted.

Communications

From the Oregon City Planning Commission to the Mayor and announcing the dinner meeting to be held at the West Linn Inn at 6.30 P.M. on Tuesday, Sept. 30.

From Thos. E. Black, District Manager, B.P.A. announcing the conference to be held at Longview on Sept. 8.

From State Highway Dept. stating that the contract for paving on N. First Avenue, Douglas st. and N. Second Avenue had been completed and accepted by the Commission.

From the Oregon Highway Protective Assn. to the members of the city Council, calling attention to Nos. 318 and 331 to be on the November election ballots, being bills sponsored by the long-haul truckers group.

Reports

Chief of Police Rivers presented his report for August, which was read by the Recorder. In addition to many activities mentioned in detail, the report showed miles covered - 2841, average miles to gallon - 12.76.

The Recorder reported 15 cases in his court with fines assessed and paid of \$ 205.00-costs \$ 41.50.

Fire Chief Yoder reported no calls in the City during the month. In the rural district five calls, the Christian and Missionary Alliance pavilion fire being the only serious one, resulting in a total loss of estimated \$ 7000.

Supt. Raines reported on the cost of the cemetery water line extension as being \$ 5050.68 plus additional cost of that inside the city limits of \$580.54.

He also submitted irrigation rates as recommended by the B.P.A. for electric power.

In this connection, Neal Thompson thought that for him, the proposed rates were rather high and it was suggested that the water commissioner and those interested in using city water for irrigation meet with B.P.A. in a preliminary meeting and report back results to the Council.

Water Commissioner Hill then stated that in his opinion a charge of \$ 300. should be made for future hook-ups on the Cemetery line outside the city limits.

This being satisfactory to the other members, the City Attorney was asked to prepare a necessary ordinance.

It was also decided that the Cemetery fund be charged at present with the sum of \$ 1700. (the amount budgeted) and that the balance of one half the total cost, or \$ 2525.34 be made up from future cut-ins, of which $\frac{1}{2}$ is to go to each fund-water and Cemetery.

Councilman Kraft reported no new developments in the matter of the erection of the new fire station .

Mrs. Clay, assistant bookkeeper asked for two weeks vacation commencing Sept. 8, the same being allowed withpay allowance of one week.

Mrs. Decker reported that auditor Wilson was about ready to set up new water fund books, as previously recommended and Councilman Hill suggested that before ordering this done, we find out the approximate cost. (Later Wilson was contacted and estimated not over \$ 100.00 -was told to proceed) .

The Recorder was instructed to obtain fidelity bond for Mrs. Clay in the sum of \$ 1000 .

Earl Oliver submitted for inspection, his deed to the property at the corner of N.E. 2nd. and Ivy and showing the purchase price of the same; the idea being to enable the council to arrive at a fair value of the piece of ground included in Oliver's deed, to which the city had title. There being some question as to the description of the land involved, Oliver was asked to have his attorney re-check.

ORDINANCES

No. 368 to make S.W. 4th. Avenue from "FirPlace" to Elm St. a 40 foot street and No. 369 to make N.W. 6th Avenue from Grant St. to the Jack Meek property a 40 foot street, then came up for final action and on motion, seconded and carried, duly passed. Roll call-Yeas 4-nays 0.
