Regular Monthly Meeting M. .ay, Octo. 6-1952

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday, October 6 and called to order at 8.30 P.M.

Present: Mayor Irwin, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, Chief of Police Rivers, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Cutsforth, Girod and Rupp. Absent Hill and Kraft. The minutes of the previous regular meeting of Sept. 2 were read and approved.

Communications

Letter from Morgan H. Hattford, Portland architect, offering his services in connection with the construction of a new fire hall.

The Recorder then read a tentative agreement presented by the Rural Fire District directors for the consideration of the Council and relative to the construction and joint ownership of the proposed fire hall.

Messrs Sperb, Rutherford and Brooks, three directors of the rural district, then joined with the members of the Council in a discussion as to a plan of procedure.

It was then moved by Girod, seconded by Anderson and carried, that the Mayor appoint a committee of two from the Council to meet with the directors of the rural district and their attorney, (our attorney also to be present) and arrive at a satisfactory agreement to be officially signed by both parties.

The Mayor then appointed Councilmen Kraft and Anderson as this committee.

Reports

City Treasurer Johnson submitted his report covering the quarter ending Sept. 30, which was accepted subject to audit by the finance committee. Chief of Police Rivers report for the month of September was read by the Recorder.

Fire Chief Yoder's report showed np city calls during the month-6 rural calls. The Recorder reported 10 cases in his Court resulting in fines of \$ 82.50 with

costs of § 18.00. Also one case dismissed, two failed to appear and one carried over to October.

Whereupon Mr. C.C.Lamb addressed the Council asking for city electric service on behalf of himself, G.W.White and the Ellis property, all being just outside of the city limits.

This matter was left to Supt. Raines and Councilman Girod with power to grant the extension after cost had been estimated and approved by petitioners.

The Recorder then read an ordinance prepared by the city attorney and relative to future cut-ings by those outside city limits. This, however was referred back for change, and to come up at the next regular meeting.

The attorney was also asked to draw an ordinance amending the present ordinance governing irrigation rates.
