

Regular Monthly Meeting
November 3-1952

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday, November 3. Present: Mayor Irwin, Supt. Raines, the Recorder, Chief of Police Rivers and Councilmen Anderson, Cutsforth, Girod, Hill, Kraft and Rupp.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of October 6 read and approved.

Communications

From Mrs. Merton G. Ellis stating that she would be glad to have her property served by the City's electric power system.

From the "Defense Electric Power Administration" relative to the curtailment of electric power by customers using more than 8000 kwh per week; also asking that steps be taken to secure voluntary reductions by smaller customers.

Mr. Ed. Johnson then addressed the Council relative to the lighting of Wait Park for summer activities, stating that the Lion's club would cooperate.

Reports.

Supt. Raines reported the completion of electric power service to the Lamb, White, Ellise and Hale properties, also that the work on Grant st. was practically done. He also suggested that Mr. McArthur be allowed a vacation, inasmuch as he had been working for the City several years without one.

In this connection, it was moved, seconded and carried, that McArthur be granted two weeks lay-off with pay.

The report of Police Chief Rivers for the previous month was then read by the Recorder.

The Recorder then reported ten cases in court during October, resulting in fines of \$ 142.50 -costs \$ 28.50.

Councilman Kraft reported that arrangements had been made for a meeting with directors of the Rural Fire District on Friday, November 7, to discuss the proposed new fire station matter.

The matter of pay for the election boards was then presented and it was decided that a warrant for \$ 40.00 be drawn for that purpose and \$ 2.00 each be distributed to the members of the boards in each precinct.

It was then bro't to the attention of the Council, that there was no record of the acceptance by the City of the platted Brown Tract in the S.E. part of town and that City Engineer Milln should be notified accordingly.

Whereupon, with reference to a piece of land included in the property deeded to Earl Oliver and wife, situated on N.E. 3rd. Avenue and at one time used by the City as a dog pound and title as of record still being in the City of Canby, the following Resolution was introduced by Anderson, seconded by Hill and unanimously carried and declared adopted and to be published in the Canby Herald in the prescribed legal manner :

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The following described real property situated within the Corporate Limits of the City of Canby, County of Clackamas, State of Oregon, was conveyed to the City of Canby by Deed Recorded in Book 54, Page 333, Deed Records of Clackamas County, State of Oregon, and

WHEREAS, The real property hereinafter described has been continuously occupied by Earl Oliver and Sabina Oliver, his wife, and his predecessors in title for a period of more than ten years, and

WHEREAS, It is to the best interest of the City of Canby to confirm the title in the said Earl Oliver and Sabina Oliver, his wife,

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it Resolved by the City of Canby by and through its Common Council, that the Mayor and Recorder of said City be and hereby are authorized and directed to make, execute and deliver to the said Earl Oliver and Sabina Oliver, his wife, a good and sufficient Deed of Conveyance to the following described real property situated in the County of Clackamas, State of Oregon, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the South boundary of 3rd Street of Lee's Addition to Canby, County of Clackamas and State of Oregon. Said point being North 63 degrees East 140 feet, and South 27 degrees East 140 feet distant from the Southwest corner of said Lee's Addition to Canby. Said Southwest corner being marked with an iron pin 1 1/4 inches long diameter by 40 inches long with nut on top driven flush with ground; thence South 27

degrees East 38 feet, (more or less) to the division line running Easterly and Westerly between lands of H. A. Lee and A. H. Lee; thence North 63 degrees East 50 feet; thence North 27 degrees West 38 feet, (more or less) to the South boundary of said 3rd Street; thence South 63 degrees West 50 feet along the South boundary of said 3rd Street to the place of beginning, containing 1900 square feet of land, (more or less) and situated in the County of Clackamas and State

upon payment to the Treasurer of said City of the sum of Thirty-five and 72/100 (\$35.72) DOLLARS.

Ordinances

Ordinance No. 370 amending Ordinance No. 314, Schedule 2 governing rules, rates and regulations was introduced, read and passed on its first reading, ordered posted and to come for final action at the next regular meeting of the Council to be held on Monday, December 1-1952.

Ordinance prepared by the city attorney relative to rates to be charged for cut-ins outside the city limits was read, but sent back for changes.

Whereupon in the matter of insurance on the Cemetery buildings and contents, (the present policy about to expire), on motion by Kraft, seconded by Anderson and carried, it was voted to apply for coverage as follows:

\$ 2500 on dwelling-\$ 500 on barn- \$ 750 on tool house and \$ 750 on contents of tool house. 3 year premium \$ 43.02 .

It then appearing that a new flag was needed for the City Hall flag staff, the Recorder was instructed to make the purchase.
