

Regul Monthly Meeting
City Council
Monday, Dec. 1-1952

The City Council met in regular session on Monday, Dec. 1 and was called to order at 8.30 P.M.

Present: Mayor Irwin, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, Chief of Police Leo McClurg, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Cutsforth, Hill, Kraft and Rupp. Absent-Cirod.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of November 3 and those of the special meeting of November 6 were read and approved.

Communications.

A letter from Robert E. Rivers, announcing his resignation as Chief of Police was read, the resignation being accepted and Lep McClurg being appointed to that position.

Letter from Gus Norwood, Secretary of the N.W. Public Power Association, stating that many wholesale power contracts with BPA are defective or out of date and that any contract revision should have careful study.

Mr. Floyd Jerman then asked the Council for electric power hook-up for his restaurant on the Highway just beyond the Colony Inn and outside the city limits.

No objection being raised as to this, it was so ordered, the customer to pay all installation charges as in similar cases.

Reports

Fire chief Yoder reported one city call and one rural district call during November with no damage resulting. Also stated that delivery was expected soon of items ordered under the civil defense program of "matching funds".

Police Chief McClurg's monthly report was presented showing in detail the activities of the department, such as arrests, warnings, cost of police car operations and miscellaneous matters.

The Recorder reported 18 cases in his Court during November, resulting in gross fines of \$ 175.00-costs \$ 40.00. Also two building permits issued.

Ordinances.

Ordinance No. 370 amending Schedule 2 of Ordinance No. 314 relating to commercial lighting and power rates came up for final action and on motion, seconded and carried, declared adopted: On roll call, Yeas 5 nays 0.

Ordinance No. 371 amending Rule 6 of Ordinance 313 governing water rates was then introduced, passed on first reading, ordered posted and to come up for final action at the next regular meeting of the Council to be held on Monday, January 5-1953.

It was then moved, seconded and carried, that the following licenses for 1953 be approved:

Dexter Fairbank to operate so-called auto "junk yard".
Hi-Way Market to sell package beer.
Frank Rice to dispense bottle beer.

Whereupon on motion, seconded and carried, it was voted to have extended for a period of five years, the \$ 5000 fire insurance policy on supplies carried in the shed and basement, the present policy expiring at this time and having been written for only one year.

Councilman Kraft then bro't up the matter of allowing the Quonset Hut to be used for various public purposes, stating that one of the church pastors had asked for its use in behalf of the "Youth Movement".

It appearing that others had also applied for the same privilege, after considerable discussion, it was left to Police Chief McClurg to work out some satisfactory arrangement.

Supt. Raines then told the Council that it would soon be necessary to re-build power lines on the Ferry Road and was at a loss as to just where to set the pole line. It was suggested that Raines and Anderson consult with the County Court in the matter.

The question of the ownership of trees in front of individual property owners then being raised, the City Attorney agreed to get an opinion on this, also as to liability in case of sidewalk accidents, resulting from flaws in walk.
