

Regular Monthly Meeting
City Council
Monday, January 7-1952

The regular monthly meeting was held on Monday, Jan. 7 and called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor Irwin, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, Chief of Police Hudson, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Cutsforth, Girod, Hill, Kraft and Rupp.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of Dec. 3 were read and approved.

Communications

Notification from the State Ind. Accident Commission that the claim of Lawrence Graham for injury allegedly sustained on August 16, 1951 had been rejected.

Letter from Lloyd L. Allen, District Manager of the Bonneville Power Administration-Lower Columbia District, to Supt. Raines and relative to wholesale power rates.

Communication from State Department of Education to Fire Chief Yoder relative to schools for firemen.

Order of business was then suspended in order to listen to visitors present, who apparently had something on their minds.

Ben Battleson spoke for himself and neighbors in regard to condition of S.E. 2nd Avenue, stating that gravel, which he had placed in front of his property at his own expense, had been more or less removed by the City road grader, creating a very bad situation in that cars could no longer park in front of his property.

Other residents also complained of the lack of drainage on the same street and asked for immediate relief, which was promised them.

Messrs. M.A. Larson and Lars Steffenson also complained of the condition of So. Knott street, but were told by Supt. Raines that the City had no funds for improvement of streets.

Albert Berg and Rufus Kraxberger from the Canby Telephone Association then addressed the Council, protesting against any pole contacting charge, as had been suggested by Supt. Raines. In the ensuing discussion, it developed that the telephone company had 386 contacts on city poles and that the City had 40 contacts on telephone poles. No action was taken in this matter, but it was divulged that the telephone franchise would expire next July and that before that time it would be necessary to come to some solution.

Fire Chief reported two calls in December, resulting in losses of \$ 1800. He also reported for the year 1951-24 answers to alarms, in which fire losses amounted to \$ 2450.00-value of properties involved being \$ 14240.00 . Number of Rural Fire District alarms during past year, 43, with losses of \$ 9775, value of properties involved \$ 52900.00. Chief Yoder also stated that State Pump Instructor Earl Albright would conduct a school in Portland from Jan. 22 to Febr. 5, which he thought should be attended by as many of the department as possible.

Supt. Raines then read a report covering the Light, Water and Road departments, showing receipts , disbursements and inventory .

Then ensued a discussion concerning the use of the city streets by logging trucks and other heavily loaded vehicles, which matter had been bro't up by Chief Hudson in his report; it was left to Councilman Anderson and Atty. Zimmerman to frame an ordinance covering this.

It was then moved by Kraft, seconded by Anderson and carried, that starting with January 1952, the salary of Chief of Police Hudson be \$ 285.00 per month and that of night policeman Younce be \$ 260.00.

It was also moved by Anderson, seconded by Hill and carried, that the salary or wages of those employees desiring their pay twice a month, be paid on the 5th and 20th. and for the periods ending the first and 15th. of each month.

Whereupon Councilman Hill suggested that the State Highway Commission be asked to check up the new signal light, as some things about it did not seem to be working satisfactorily. In this connection, Mr. Raines agreed to contact the proper person.

Councilman Hill then mentioned the bad condition of Grant street in front of the Oddf'elows building and was promised that improvements would be made.
