

Regular Monthly Meeting
Monday, February 4, 1952

The City Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, Febr. 4, 1952 and was called to order by Mayor Irwin at 8.15 P. M.

Present: Mayor Irwin, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt, Raines, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Girod, Hill and Kraft. Absent, Cutsforth and Rupp.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of January 7 and those of special meeting of January 23 were read and approved.

Communications

Under this head, the Recorder read a letter from the B.P.A. to Mayor Irwin, extending an invitation to him and the members of the City Council to attend a meeting at Vancouver on February 21st., at which meeting various problems would be discussed of interest to all customers.

Circular letter from the " Voluntary Credit Restraint Committee" created in connection with the Defense Production Act of 1950 and relative to the screening of proposed State and Local Government Borrowing.

From the Capital Office Equip. Co. in Salem, offering to furnish semi-annual inspection and services for our typewriters at a price of \$ 17.04 each.

From one, J. Wright Baylor of Priest River, Idaho inquiring about Canby' s electric rates, taxes, population and various other municipal matters.

Reports

Fire Chief Yoder-two calls in the City during the month, one with no loss resulting , the other being Walter Meek's ,Jr. chicken plant, with a loss of approximately \$ 2000. covered by insurance. One rural call-damages \$ 500.

Yoder also thought something should be done about the sawmill trash being dumped in the pit and suggested that a road be improved for the convenience of fire trucks, if necessary.

The Recorder reported 15 cases in his Court during the month, resulting in fines assessed of \$ 165.00-costs \$ 36.00.

Police Chief Hudson's report showed nothing unusual, other than a burglary at Castner's Service Station-\$ 35.00 being removed.

Mayor Irwin then stated that at this time he would appoint another Sewerage committee, two of the old committee being no longer available.

He then named the following:

Councilman Anderson then bro't up the matter of street/ grades, especially mentioning the Frank Rice property. In the ensuing discussion, other properties were mentioned and any action left to the Street Committee.

It was then moved by Girod, seconded by Kraft and carried, that the Fire Dept. be allowed the sum of \$ 16.00 for expenses of those attending the convention in Portland.

It then appearing that some S.P. car cleaning had been repeated too close to the business center, the Recorder was asked to again write to the Superintendent in Portland and at the same time mention the mess from the saw-mill.

Councilman Girod then stated that having heard of much objection to the spending of county money for the proposed Canby Ferry, he would suggest that more pressure be made on the County Court. In this connection, Tom Gerber was asked to formulate a letter to be signed by the City officials.

Mr. Girod also suggested that the public should be informed as the result of the recent inventories of city property and that a committee be named for this purpose. Councilman Hill thought the committee should be made up of citizens outside the Council; Kraft wanted to include one council member, which was then agreed upon and the Mayor appointed Messrs. Chris Kraft-Geo. Berg and Rex Eversole.
