

Regular Monthly Meeting
Monday, April 7-1952

The Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, April 7 and was called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor Irwin, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, Chief of Police Hudson, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Cutsforth, Girod, Hill, Kraft and Rupp.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of March 3 were read and approved.

The mayor then stated that the regular order of business would be suspended and special matters be given attention.

Whereupon City Engineer Milln presented the plat of the Earl Oliver, for approval and after examination and discussion, on motion by Hill seconded by Kraft, the Council voted to accept the same.

The plat of the Weygandt tract was also presented and on motion by Anderson, seconded by Kraft and carried, this was also accepted, subject to grading and graveling.

The matter of the extension of So. 4th. avenue was then discussed, but any action was postponed until Supt. Raines could contact the property owners interested.

It then appeared that a delegation was present, being resident owners in the vicinity of the Rene DuPont property in North Canby and who objected to the proposed erection of a horse barn on his property. The principal objections were probable odors, flies and other insects, which would undoubtedly breed-all resulting in the depreciation of values to surrounding property.

Mr. DuPont responded by saying that he had already purchased lumber and other material for the building. He also pointed out, that it had been known for some time that he was contemplating this action and that no objections had been raised until this late date. He furthermore stated that he expected to keep at all times a clean and sanitary condition, which would not be an annoyance to his neighbors.

After considerable discussion, pro and con, Mayor Irwin stated that there was no ordinance, the terms of which would forbid a person to erect a barn or stable on his own premises and until such a building was finished and proved to be a public nuisance, no action could be taken by the Council.

Ed. Mueller then complained to the Council that the city employees in operating on his place had damaged some of his pipe line and left more or less debris, which he wanted to have cleaned up. He was promised that the matter would receive attention.

Ed. Thompson wanted to know if the Greyhound busses were to be allowed to operate in the future around the block in which he lived and, if so wished to register his objection. Was told this matter would be taken under consideration.

Whereupon, with reference to the proposed new building for the housing of fire equipment, Messrs. Sperb and Rutherford being present, confirmed the action of the Rural Fire District, to the effect that it was in favor of a joint ownership of a building to be erected on lot at corner of 2nd. & Grant sts. Proposed building to be suitable for housing 6 pieces of equipment and facilities for the firemen; cost not to exceed \$ 30000.00.

In connection with the above and on motion, seconded and carried, the following ordinance was introduced, passed on first reading and ordered published, said ordinance reading in part as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 365

AN ACT to call a special election to be held in the City of Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon, for the purpose of voting a special tax levy to erect an additional fire station within the corporate limits of Canby; to issue and sell bonds, if necessary, to pay for its share of the costs in the erection of such fire station.

And that said proposed tax levy be placed on the ballot for the approval of the legal voters of Canby, at a special election to be held on May 16, 1952 at the two regular voting precincts in said City.

Reports

The Recorder reported 29 cases held in his Court during the month, resulting in fines aggregating \$ 380.00-Costs \$ 77.50 .

Chief of Police submitted report in detail and which included nothing of any great importance.

Fire Chief Yoder reported one call in the City and one for Rural District, with no damages.

Councilman Rupp reported having purchased or about to buy, various equipment for the Cemetery-lowering device, greens and tent, all of which were authorized by the Council.

The committee appointed to check on the inventory of the equipment, supplies, etc. of the City, recently compiled by Curtis Johnson, Jr. submitted it's findings, and on motion by Girod, seconded by Hill and carried, it was ordered to be made a part of these minutes:

TO THE HONORABLE MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF CANBY , OREGON.

We the committee appointed by mayor George Irvin wish to make the following report after giving due consideration to the physical inventory taken by Curtis Johnson Jr., which we compared with the book inventory as kept by the office force of the Light Department of the City of Canby:

That the difference of \$ 49.76 is not excessive covering the period of one year;

That there were small differences on some items up to \$ 13.57 on wire;

That no inventory was taken on poles an item according to the book inventory amounts to \$2927.00 on 253 poles of various lenghts. The reason given was that poles were so mixed in the yard that an accurate count would be very difficult.

We wish to make the following recommendations:

That an inventory of each department be taken twice per year, on June 30st and on Dec. 31. Reconcile these inventories with the book inventories and make a report to the city council;

That the Water and Light Superintendant either make or O K all work orders before turning same over to the office force;

That the name of the articles on the work order coincide with the names used on the invoices.
