

Regular Monthly Meeting
May 5-1952

The City Council met in Regular session on Monday, May 5 and was called to order at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Irwin, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, Chief of Police Hudson, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Cutsforth, Girod, Hill, Kraft and Rupp.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of April 7 were read and approved.

Communications

From High School directors expressing appreciation for work done on street in front of grounds.

From County health department relative to mosquito control.

From Chief Hudson asking the Council to accept his resignation as of June 1st. Petition from Jos. E. Clausen, et al asking for the oiling of the following streets and avenues, each year for a three year period, the cost of which to be assessed against adjacent property owners:

Streets and avenues involved:

South 6th. Avenue from Fir to Elm
Elm from 6th to 4th.
50 feet south from 6th. on Elm
110 feet south from 6th. on Fir

Earl Oliver then addressed the Council asking for a quit claim from the City to a piece of ground (38 x 50 feet) between his residence and that of Elmer Anderson, Jr. on South 3rd. Avenue, which he supposed was included in his original purchase of the property.

In this matter it was decided that Oliver should check the original price paid, before any action could be taken.

Oliver also stated that he proposed to circulate a petition to widen Ferry Road from its intersection with Holly to the city limits.

Reports of Officers

The City Treasurer read his report covering the first quarter ending March 31, the same being accepted subject to the audit of the Finance Committee.

Chief of Police Hudson submitted his report for April , showing nothing unusual.

The Recorder reported ten cases in his Court with fines of \$ 172.50 assessed, costs \$ 33.50.

Fire Chief reported call to New Era on April 12, no damage; on April 17 truck fire on 99E with loss of \$ 500.00 and on May 2 call to Cottage Home-no loss.

Chief Yoder also asked that expense money of \$ 125 be allowed firemen who desired to attend the annual convention at Medford-Allowed on motion by Kraft, seconded by Hill and Carried.

Mayor Irwin then stated that he would set May 15 -8 o'clock P.M. as the date and time for the Council to meet with the Budget Committee.

The question of adopting the " Daylight Saving's Time " then came up for discussion and it was decided to make no change for the time being.

It was also decided not to recommend any changes in the routing of the Greyhound busses, as had been requested by some property owners interested.

It was then moved, seconded and carried to accept the resignation of Chief of Police Hudson in accordance with his request as mentioned above.

In the matter of the extension of N.W. 6th. Avenue, it was reported that the school board was reluctant to do anything, but might consider granting an extra strip providing it would not allow Thornton more than about 10 feet of space in front of his dwelling. The Council went on record as favoring a 40' street with sidewalk on the north side and expense of grading and graveling to be assumed by property owners on that side.

It then appearing that the well at Zion Cemetery had outlived its usefulness, Messrs. Hill, Rupp and Raines were asked to get estimates and figures on cost of new well and also extension of the present line.

Supt. Raines then asked the Council for the privilege of negotiating with the Cowlitz County, Wash. officials with the idea of making arrangements for the testing of light meters, they having the necessary equipment. Granted.

City Attorney was then requested to draw up an Ordinance in accordance with the Clausen petition for the oiling of the various streets and avenues mentioned, the same to be presented at the next regular meeting.

Whereupon it appearing that the City of Barlow desired to have fire protection from the Canby Volunteer Fire Department, it was moved by Girod, seconded by Rupp and carried, that the same be granted; a charge of \$ 50.00 per year to be made, which is to be turned over to the Fire Dept.

Ordinance, No. 365

Ordinance No. 365 calling for a special election to be held on May 16, to vote for a special tax levy for the purpose of erecting a fire station was then placed on its final passage, passed and so ordered. Yeas 6-nays 0.
