

The Council immediately after a session with the budget committee, was called to order in special meeting, with all members present except Councilman Cutsforth.

Whereupon on motion by Kraft, seconded by Anderson and carried, it was voted to adopt the 1952-53 budget as set up by the committee, the same ordered published in the next two issues of the Canby Herald ( May 22 and 29 ) and that June 16 be designated as the date for public hearing; at which time anyone desiring to present objections or remonstrances would be heard.

Whereupon Mr. Verne Heath addressed the Council, stating that he wanted to hold public auctions from time to time, but the license fee established under the City's ordinance was rather discouraging and asked if the fee could not be reduced. After some discussion it was suggested to Mr. Heath, that he hold two sales, paying the present fee, then bring up the matter again, providing the business did not warrant the payment of the fee now called for. This he agreed to do.

No other business appearing, on motion, seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned.

### Special-May 19-1952

The Council met in special session on Monday, May 19 and was called to order at 8.30 P.M. The Mayor and all councilmen present except Girod.

The Mayor announced that the meeting had been called for the purpose of canvassing the votes cast at the election on May 16, for and against the proposed bond issue for the City's share of expense of a new fire station.

After examination of the poll books the results were found to be as follows:

Whereupon the Mayor announced that the measure had been carried by the above vote.

Councilman Kraft then reported that he had an application from Bob Rivers for the position of Chief of Police. He stated that Rivers was well recommended by the Chief in Oregon City, as being a capable officer on his force. The matter was left in the hands of Kraft.

A petition signed by 175 citizens was then presented to the Council, asking that Canby be placed on Daylight Savings time as of Sunday midnight, May 25.

After considerable argument, pro and con, it was voted 4 to 0 that it be recommended that clocks be advanced one hour as of the above date and it was so proclaimed by Mayor Irwin.

Whereupon it was moved by Anderson, seconded by Hill and Carried, that S.W. 4th. Avenue from Fir Place to Elm be made a 40' street and an ordinance be so drawn.
