## Regular Meeting Monday, August 6,1951

The City Council met in regular session on Monday, August 6 and was called to order at 8.30 P.M.

Present: Mayor Irwin, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt, Raines, Chief of Police

Hudson, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Cutsforth, Girod, Kraft and Rupp. Absent, Hill.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of July 2 and those of the special meetings held on July 12 and 13 were read and on motion, seconded and carried, declared approved.

The regular order of business was then suspended for a while to

take up special matters.

Lindsay Wilson, accountant for Peipenbronk and Kron, who had recently audited the books and accounts of the City, read his report and explained in detail his figures.

It was then moved by Girod, seconded by Kraft and carried, that

the report be accepted and plac ed in the files.

Ed. Mueller then addressed the Council, stating that in connection with some remarks he had made at a previous meeting he had attended, he had been accused by a member of the Fire Department as being critical of the organization. Mr. Mueller stated that he had no intention of criticising the Dep't. and was sorry if he had said anything out of order, as he realized the boys were doing a fine job. order, as he realized the boys were doing a fine job. F.G.McNamee, being present, then asked the Council if there could

not be some understanding relative to the garbage collecting problem.

He stated that if the Torgeson contract was to be canceled, he would like to be considered as interested in taking over; otherwise he was through. This matter was left to the Mayor and Councilmen Anderson to work out.

Albin Erickson then presented to the Council a map showing street desired through his property and that of Jim Hudson's, running in a northerly direction from S.W. 6th. Avenue. Left to gaines and Counilman Anderson to check up, with the aid of Ralph Milln.

#### Communications

From the Oregon State Highway Commission relative to the instalation of traffic light at Pacific Highway and Molalla Avenue and enclosing contract to be signed.

In connection with this, it was moved by Girod, seconded by Kraft and carried, that the Mayor and Recorder be instructed to sign the contract subject to a satisfactory explanation of Paragraph No. 3, under " Things to be done by the City".

Letter from the Wood Tractor Co. again asking for payment of bill of \$ 76.87 for repairs to grader and stating that any deduction of the amount was not in order. This matter was left to Councilman Anderson, who would contact the company personally on his first trip to Portland.

Neill Thompson then asked that he be furnished electrical venergy by the City for his irrigation system, with the understanding that he would advance the cost of labor and material, which costs would be returned to him in power over a three pear period.

Whereupon on motion by Anderson, seconded by Cutsforth and carried, Supt. Raines was instructed to build the lines, with the understanding

as above.

## Ordinance No. 364

Ordinance No. 364, levying a tax of \$ 9236.50 on all taxable property, both real and personal within the corporate limits of Canby was placed on it's final passage. Yeas 5-nays 0. so ordered.

### Reports

Councilman reported having met with the directors of the Rural Fire District, but that as yet they had no definite plans for the construction of a new building.

Jack Stein reported having collected the sum of \$ 38.58 from

soft ball games held in the City Park, with small expense.

He asked that permission be given to use the funds for holding a picnic. There being no action or response to this, apparently

silence gave consent".
Supt. Raines stated that there was need for the purchase of six re-closures, which were priced at \$ 190 each. This was left to Councilman Girod and Raines .

Raines then asked for a week's vacation at this time, which was allowed.

# August 6-continued.

The usual report of Police Chief Hudson was read by the Recorder. Fire Chief Yoder reported & calls made by the City equipment and & by the Rural, mostly grass fires and the city dump. Yoder stated that inspection of buildings for fire hazards was under way and also that a trial run under the civil defense plan had been made to Portland recently.

The Recorder reported 13 cases held in his court during the month, resulting in fines of \$ 137.00 costs \$ 32.00.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that the City assume one-half of the expense of decorations for the county fair, the total sum not to exceed \$ 100.00
