

Regular Meeting  
Tuesd , Sept. 4-1951

The City Council met in regular monthly session on Tuesday, Sept. 4, the first Monday being a legal holiday.  
Present: Mayor Irwin, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt, Raines, Chief of Police, Hudson, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Girod, Hill, Kraft and Rupp.  
Absent-Councilman Cutsforth.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of August 6 and those of special meeting on August 22 were read and approved.

The regular order of business was then suspended and the council listened to Mr. Roderick connected with the engineering firm of Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merryfield.

Mr. Roderick presented figures showing an estimate of a present cost of the proposed sewer system and treatment plant as follows:

The regular order of business was then resumed and the following communications were read :

From the League of Oregon Cities relative to information asked concerning the State Ind. Accident Commission's requirements of one cent per day from each employee and enclosing opinion by the Atty. General. ( Makes no difference whether paid by employer or employee.)

From Parker, Hill and Ingman asking that a date be set, at which time they could meet with the Council and present their report on the water system.

From the State Highway Commission acknowledging receipt of \$ 1900 remittance and signed agreement relative to traffic light to be installed at 99E and Molalla Avenue.

From the Public Employee's Retirement System enclosing contracts for signatures and regulations relative to placing city employees under the Social Security System of the Federal Govt.

In connection with this, the Mayor and Recorder were authorized to sign and return contracts.

Various Reports

" Bud " Kraft reported having collected \$ 109.50 from the girls soft ball games and paid out \$ 73.15 leaving a balance of \$ 36.35.

He stated that some of the players had sustained injuries that required medical attention and recommended that their bills be paid.

On motion, seconded and carried, his report was approved, together with recommendations.

Chief of Police Hudson reported on police activities for the month, nothing much having occurred outside of regular routine.

The Recorder reported 7 cases in Court during August resulting in fines of \$ 90.00-costs \$ 20.00.

Councilmen Kraft stated that no new applications had been received for the job of nightwatchman, but said that Loyd Younce might again be available. No objections were raised to this and the matter was left to Kraft to act as he saw fit.

Mr. Kraft also bro't up the subject of purchasing a new police car and was asked to work with Councilman Hill and report results at the next meeting of the Council on October 1.

A deed signed by J.F.Hudson and Albin Erickson was then presented to the Council, conveying a 60 foot street through their property and running north from S.W. 6th. Avenue to a dead end.

On motion of Anderson, seconded by Hill and carried, it was voted to accept the conveyance subject to grading and graveling by owners.

It then appearing that the County Court was about to purchase a ferry boat, to be placed in operation on the Willamette north of Canby, but subject to the approval of Ralph Milln's office, the Recorder was asked to write Milln, urging him to furnish any possible aid in the matter.

It then having been reported that a stop sign was needed on S.W. 4th. avenue near it's intersection with Elm, Supt. Raines was requested to install same as soon as possible.

The following bills and claims were then presented and on motion, seconded and carried, ordered paid and warrants drawn: Yeas 5-nays 0.
