

Special Meeting
Thursday, Sept. 13-1951

The Council sat in special session on Thursday, Sept. 13 and was called to order at about 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor Irwin, Supt. Raines, the Recorder and Councilmen Anderson, Cutsforth, Girod, Hill, Kraft and Rupp.

The Mayor announced that the meeting had been called for the purpose of listening to representatives of the firm of Parker, Hill and Ingman, Seattle engineers, as to their findings in the water situation and recommendations for improvements.

Messrs. Hill and Johnson then submitted and read a very complete report on Canby's water system and answered many questions put to them by the members of the Council.

Their principal recommendations were : the completion of an infiltration gallery in the Molalla River bed, after first digging test pits and doing some test pumping; additional storage facilities; and replacing old pipe, which they claimed were causing a 25% loss in our water supply.

Whereupon it was moved by Hill, seconded by Girod and carried, that the report be accepted and placed on file for further consideration.

After some further discussion, no other business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
