

Monday, November 5-1951

The Council met in regular session on Monday, November 5 and was called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor Irwin, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, Chief of Police Hudson, the Recorder and Councilmen Cussforth, Girod, Kraft and Rupp. Absent-Anderson and Hill.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of October first were read and approved.

Communications.

Letter from Rev. G.M. Trygstad speaking for the ministerial association of Canby asking for the approval of church signs which they proposed to install on 99E at both entrances to the City.

There being no objections to this, the Recorder was instructed to answer, voicing the approval of the Council.

The Recorder then read the bid of the Eversole Motors, offering to furnish a new police car : two bids were presented, one for \$ 1956.73, car to be equipped with a 110 H.P. motor and the other for \$ 1867.73, with 100 H.P. motor; both by Eversole and no other bids having been received.

Whereupon on motion by Kraft, seconded by Rupp and carried, the first mentioned bid was accepted and which reads as follows:

Floyd Galbraith then submitted prices for various equipment for use at the Cemetery, this matter having been bro't up at the last meeting. After some discussion, the Mayor appointed Mr. Girod to serve with Mr. Rupp in a further investigation of the same; the idea being that more or less profit could accrue to the City by owning equipment now furnished by the morticians.

A letter from the State Highway Commission was then read, stating that owing to the difficulty in obtaining electrical supplies, completion of the installation of the traffic signal light for 99E and Molalla Road was not expected for 60 days, their letter being dated October 11.

Whereupon three employees of the City, Don Stajgr, Loyal Crawford and Kenneth McNamee, being present, asked for an increase in wages of 15c per hour.

Floyd Galbraith, caretaker at the Cemetery also asked for an additional increase of \$ 25 per month. (no action) .

The Mayor then announced that Mr. Clark Harding, being present wished to address the Council and urge the purchase of a " Paymaster" check protector to be used on warrants issued by the Recorder. Two models were offered, one for \$ 159.50, the other \$ 127.50. On motion by Girod, seconded by Kraft and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were authorized to purchase the one which seemed most suitable.

Reports

Fire Chief reported no city calls during the month; three rural calls with losses of about \$ 300. Also stated that No. 2 truck should be painted, which would cost about \$ 135.00; also needed some hand lanterns, costing \$ 4.75 each.

Both these matters left to Councilman ^{Kraft} and Chief Yoder.

Police Chief Hudson submitted his usual monthly report.

The Recorder reported 6 cases in his Court with fines of \$ 60.00-costs \$ 15.00.

Supt. Raines reported the cost of the new infiltration gallery to be \$ 6985.37. Also that four additional transformers had been purchased and that a level to be used in setting poles was needed, also lanterns for trucks.

Mrs. Decker asked that her assistant, Mrs. Clay now be placed on full time, as the work was too much for one person. This matter left to the Mayor, with no objections from any of the council.

Whereupon the matter of extending water service to Emi Kraft and several others just outside of the city limits on the Cemetery Road was bro't up, it appearing that the prospective customers would probably be willing to stand the expense of the additional pipe to their respective properties.

This matter was met with favorable consideration by all members present and left to Water Commissioner Larry Hill for further investigation.

The matter of extending S.W. 4th. Avenue from Fir to Elm, desired by some of the property owners in that vicinity was then considered, with no action taken, as it would first be necessary to have a survey made.
