

Regular Monthly Meeting
December 3-1951

The Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, December 3 and was called to order at 8.15 P.M.

Present: Mayor Irwin, Atty. Zimmerman, Supt. Raines, the Recorder and Councilmen Cutsforth, Girod, Hill and Rupp. Absent- Anderson and Kraft.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting of November 5 were read and approved.

The Mayor then announced that the regular order of business would be suspended for the purpose of listening to Messrs Johnson and Brown of the Hardware Mutual Insurance Co. in which company the City carried coverage on the City Hall.

These gentlemen stated that they had made a careful study of the premises and believed that a fair estimate of the present valuation would be about \$ 27500.00, on which we were carrying \$ 13500.00 fire insurance.

It being apparent that not sufficient protection was in force at present, they recommended that it be increased to approximately 70% of valuation and that the garage, stock in garage and furniture and fixtures in main building be also covered.

In this connection it was later moved by Girod, seconded by Cutsforth and carried, that \$ 5500.00 more be added to the present policy on the main building, plus \$ 1500 on the garage. Also a reasonable amount to cover stock in garage and F & F in office building. (\$ 5000 on stock and \$ 2500 on F & F placed later). Extended coverage endorsement on all.

Mayor Irwin then stated that Mr. R. E. Leslie of the Portland Safe Co. was present and wished to talk about vault installations and safes.

Mr. Leslie then presented some figures and information relative to the construction of a vault in the room adjoining the main office, also stating that he had a vault door on hand, which could be purchased for \$ 170.00, the original cost being \$ 400.00.

Mr. Clarke Harding, who was also present then submitted for sale, the Royal re-built typewriter left on trial in the Recorder's office, for \$135.00 less allowance for old machine of \$ 10.00. This matter was left to further consideration by the Council.

The regular course of business was then resumed and the following communications were read by the Recorder:

From the Public Employes Retirement System, stating that the application for participation in Federal Social Security had not yet been accepted by the Administrator.

From Mr. MacKenzie thanking the Council for their part in helping to secure deferment for Raymond R. Reif.

From Dr. Raver, Bonneville Administrator announcing the appointment of Lloyd L. Allen to succeed Chas. Dunn as District Manager of the Lower Columbia District.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that the liquor licenses of the Hi-Way Market and Frank Rice be approved.

The matter of purchasing cemetery equipment was then bro't up and it was left to Rupp and Galbraith to obtain a tent and lowering device, as they saw fit.

Reports

The Recorder reported eight cases in his court during the month, resulting in fines of \$ 95.00-costs \$ 22.50.

Fire Chief Yoder reported one fire call with no damage. Also that the Rural Fire District had purchased additional equipment to be used as a tanker.

Supt. Raines reported two water projects finished. He also stated that Ralph Milln would make up a map of the City at a cost of about \$ 800.00, of which the Title and Trust Co. would stand approximately \$ 125 of \$ 150.

He also suggested to the Council that the telephone company be required to pay for it's contacts on city poles. Discussion, but no action on this.
